Okay, okay. But those again, can we trust and knowing when? What else can we talk about? We talked about watching more physical body signs. When you're in a scene, which would be things like nervous twitches, looking in their eyes. Seeing watching their body tense up different things like that. Perlman was fired in October and Rafa Loski in June. United forced two airline pilots into medical retirement based on unfounded fears and stereotypes is the defense attorney. And he said this during the news conference. The lawsuit filed in the US District Court here on Friday seeks unspecified monetary demands. Under the Americans with Disabilities Act. It named United and Federal Aviation Administration and a Federal Aviation Administration position as defendants. Let's see Dr. Carrie Kahn, Gary Cohn, medical director at United Chicago headquarters said the FAA informed the airline that the pilots have several health conditions that mandated their dismissal under agency regulations. Bondage is a form of SM in my opinion, a lighter form. It's an addition to some of the things it's about restraining not only physically but mentally, emotionally. What else can we said it has. If there's all different types of bondage hands, feet, chest, their sensory deprivation including in that which is blocking off one of the senses. So all the others are heightened, ie blindfolds, or blindfold and covering your ears. So now you can't hear or see what's going on. There's hoods, which completely cover your head and they zip up around the neck. So now all your senses are deprived except for what you can feel if your hands are not bound. And there's breathing area. There's holes in there so you can breathe in the mouth is usually open. Although some people enjoy their mouth being enclosed in some way as well. But that's that's just a light, little bit on bondage. What kind of activities encompass FM, all kinds of activities. They range from dressing fetishes, to beatings to cuttings, temporary cuttings, to body piercings to body brandings to permanent some of those. Some people enjoy body art tattoos.
