Researchers are beginning a series of studies aimed at untangling the nature and nurture of sexual orientation. They are seeking lesbians who are female twins, gay men with male twins and gay men with adoptive or genetically unrelated brothers. The sexual orientation of subjects twins and brothers does not matter. So Dr. Michael Bailey, the principal investigator who was traveling to several cities in Texas this summer to interview subjects mainly received his PhD from the University of Texas at Austin. Bailey has done two preliminary studies on the development of sexual orientation in the first study, which is to be published in Archives of Sexual behavior. He tested the theory that prenatal stress might predispose men to become gay. He found the evidence for the theory, however, he found a high rate of homosexuality among brothers of gay men. In the second study to be published in behavioral genetics, Bailey and colleagues question more than 150 pairs of male twins about their sexual orientation finding tentative evidence for some genetic influence. Individuals who fit the eligibility criteria were asked to collect the Family Studies Laboratory at Northwestern University in Chicago at seven or 84914239. Reports of homophobic violence continue in Sydney Australia, despite an increased police presence in predominantly gay and lesbian areas of the city. Three gay men were brutally beaten last

month by a gang of six teenagers who use tree stakes boots, karate and Kung Fu styled packs to inflict severe head injuries on two of the men. The Third Man was thrown out into the street in the path of oncoming traffic passers by who stopped to help the victims are credited with ending the assault, possibly saving some lives. And in Norway, a group of skinheads fired shots into a lesbian and gay club in the city of Oslo. Although no injuries were reported. Activists are accusing the right wing Norwegian government Men and some of its Christian ministers with provoking increased violence against gays and lesbians in that country.

The Student Union at the University of Queensland and Australia is conducting a student referendum this month on whether or not to establish a gay and lesbian support area on campus. If approved, office space would be provided and staff would be hired to provide counseling and support services as well as to coordinate campaigns to encompass harassment and discrimination. The University of Queensland Student Union has had a gay and lesbian rights policy for over 10 years. And despite a pattern of rejection of referenda on campus, the Queensland association of gay law reform is optimistic about approval.

Meanwhile, the administration's of University College in Dublin and rotmans college have formally recognized the lesbian and gay student groups on their respective campuses. In the case of University College, the recognition comes 10 years after the student group was formed, lobbying by student unions and lesbian and gay societies at other colleges finally led to the official recognitions, which now makes information about the groups available to incoming students and also allows them to apply for campus funding.

A judge in Nova Scotia, Canada has upheld the provinces sodomy law, saying it does not discriminate against gay men. Judge Kenneth Crowell noted that the Canadian Constitution prohibits anti gay and lesbian discrimination, but he says that the sodomy law which outlaws Adel intercourse doesn't interfere with that protection. The lawsuit arose from the case of a high school vice principal, who was found guilty of having sex with one of his students.

US Congressman Pat Williams, in Montana Democrat has introduced a measure that would provide no strings federal funding to the National Endowment for the Arts for five years. Since last October, the NEA has been prohibited by legislation sponsored by North Carolina homophobic Senator Jesse Helms from funding many works of art, including sexually explicit lesbian and gay themed works. The new measure, which is backed by the White House, would do away with that restriction.
