And this is Art. In Richmond, Virginia, the Virginia Supreme Court has ruled that homosexual parents may no longer be declared unfit and stripped of custody rights solely because of their homosexuality. The five to two decision reversed an earlier ruling by a lower court that had permanently deprived an Ohio woman of the right to see or communicate with her 11 year old son. The lower court had ruled that the mother's lesbian relationship would result in serious emotional and mental harm to the child. The Richmond decision is the first court ruling in the nation to uphold the basic parental rights of lesbians and gay males. Lawyers from the Children's Rights Project of the American Civil Liberties Union represented the mother in her appeal. While the Virginia Supreme Court held in favor of the mother and emphasize that it did not condone her lesbian lifestyle. The decision written by Albertus Harrison, a former governor of Virginia, observed that the mother's unnatural lifestyle was a proper factor to have been considered, but that lesbianism could not stand out alone, above all evidence that the mother was a devoted and fit parent every other respect. The decision concluded, "we decline to hold that every lesbian mother or homosexual father is per se, an unfit parent."

In the years of litigation, the Supreme Court of Oklahoma ordered the Regents of the University of Oklahoma to grant recognition to the Gay Activists Alliance, which is the gay student group that has been seeking official status since 1976. The courts action reverse decisions by the Student Congress, the Board of Regents and lower courts, all of which had denied GAA's application for recognition as a student organization. This recognition had formerly been denied principally on the grounds of immorality. "It is significant," said Dawn Madson of gay rights advocates, which is a National Gay Legal Group, that this decision comes from one of the most homophobic Bible Belt states, we should learn from these decisions that our First Amendment claims will receive fair hearing from even in the most conservative courts.

THE FUNDAMENTALIST CODE

Jerry Falwell, who has a remarkable resemblance to the Pillsbury Doughboy and about the same IQ is sending out letters to members of the Moral Majority that ask for money to fight to keep Washington DC from becoming the gay capital of the United States. Falwell includes photographs of flamboyant drag queens to show potential donors, quote, "the kind of individuals who want to take over our nation's capital." Falwell places the photography in a sealed envelope with the solicitation for fear that they might fall into the hands of some innocent child. Cited as horrendous facts, the homosexual population of Washington is growing rapidly. Thousands of gay people from around the country are being encouraged to move to the nation's capitol. Gay people have won support from the DC city council, and many of them now serve on city boards and commissions. Gay people have influenced Mayor Marion Barry to oppose US restrictions on foreign gay people and to modify the entrance examination of new police officers. There are over 30 gay bars and restaurants in the nation's capitol and Falwell implies that these activities constitute a takeover of Washington DC. He asked his potential donors, "After all, who actually owns Washington DC, the gay community and their 30 bar owners, or the 226 million Americans who pay taxes every year?" Falwell has asked his membership to donate money to fight what he calls a concerted effort to quote, "get their way and to gain control of our nation's capital and ultimately our country." The minister concludes with the accusation that gay people are destroying the moral value this country was built upon. "We must act fast and stop them before they spread out and take over other cities as well."

The 150,000 member national organi-- Organization of Women prepared for the final countdown to equality to ratify the Equal Rights Amendment and reaffirmed its commitment to lesbian rights as a quote priority issue for all feminist at its annual convention, as well as the National Organization of Women's controversial 1980 resolution condemning pornography, [pederasty?], public sex, and sadomasochism was once again debated in the lesbian rights workshop. Since three more states must ratify the ERA before June 30, 1982, in order to make it part of the Constitution, the majority of the conventions time was taken up with organizing a massive campaign on the ERAs behalf. However, the era was not the only issue addressed by the convention, a resolution to make a more concerted effort to initiate outreach to the lesbian and gay community was overwhelmingly approved. It singled out the assault against the rights of lesbians by several right wing and fundamentalist groups, specifically citing the proposed Family Protection Act as an important area for the national organization's work.

In Toronto, the largest regional division of Canada's largest Protestant church has moved a step closer to admitting openly gay and lesbian candidates to its ministry. The ministry Personnel and Education Committee of the United Church of Canada's Toronto conference proposed in early November that sexual orientation should not be a criterion for or against the admission of a candidate to the ministry. Reverend Robert Smith, president of the conference told Toronto body politic that this resolution will have to be approved by a general meeting of the whole conference in late spring before becoming official policy. Even then the ruling would apply only to ordinations in the south central region of Ontario. The Reverend Smith added that the United Church does not now formally prohibit the ordination of lesbians or gay men, but many conferences would have difficulty accepting them, especially ones who were open about their sexuality. A controversial United Church report on human sexuality currently being studied at

local levels prior to debate at the church's 1984 General Counsel, states that, "there is no reason in principle why mature self accepting homosexuals, any more than heterosexual, should not be ordained or commissioned."

In Palo Alto, California, voters in this city of 56,000 rejected a gay rights ordinance by a margin of nearly three to two. If passed, the measure would have prohibited discrimination on the basis of sexual orientation in housing, employment and other services. Steve Harris, spokesman for the Palo Alto Coalition for Equal Rights, which sponsored the Yes campaign cited the low voter turnout as the chief cause of the defeat. There's a spreading influence of the Moral Majority Harris noted it is becoming okay to discriminate. KPFT is having a t shirt and decal contest KPFT is conducting a contest for the best and most creative design for station t shirt and window decal this, folks, if you don't recognize it is a cheap way to get new designs, you have a contest and you give a person a prize and you get to spread all that but you get a look at everybody's before you make the decision. So if you're into designing things, listen to the rest of this announcement. And where else and that's the size of that we are going to swing now into kind of one of those monologues cool, whatever else people want to talk about and join in discussions of what's been going on with the police department this week and continuing saga since the beginning of this program, some seven years ago. We always done this redeem dying to die. And last week, we got some pretty good response off of my recounting of my history with vice captain Shane is matter of fact, I got several calls in the station got several calls. All some folks really thought it was nice one moment suggested that I be killed. And I think that was his mother, bless her heart. No offense, Mrs. Shane, it was no offense. We really love your son, he is so fun to watch and laugh at. And so we're going to be doing some more of that. But not this not the vice squad this week, except they kind of interact with a lot of uniformed police officers in the neighborhood. And we're

gonna be talking about that did some research we did kind of listened to some actuality on radio station KTRH that was given to them by chicken Hawk themed Johnny Freeman, who also had some interesting things to say about gay community and Gay Pride Week. And I can think of no better way to introduce all of this, then with who else TRB long time since we've heard good old TRB - fun because every time we put the records in the file, somebody steals them at KPFT. And somebody brought their own private collection in so here is none other than the Law and Order. Tom Robinson of Tom Robinson and other Phenomena, Tom Robinson Band and other Phenomena, got to introduce him whenever I was emceeing the podium down at the National March on Washington. And he just walked out with a guitar and kind of did a couple of songs which usually have a full accompaniment but he picked on the guitar for a while and we all felt like he had an orchestra because that was a very special day for those of us who were in the cold on Washington, October the 14th, 1979. And we haven't had any word about further manifestations of that. But Tom Robinson is certainly got a fine example for himself among gay and non gay radio listeners around the world. So here's a man that had a strong convictions and speaking of strong convictions, geez. Well, it all started when a group of representatives from the gay community met with representatives from all of the Montrose area civic groups, most of whom are gay. And George Greanias office with a full complement of police chiefs and assistant police chiefs and Sergeant, vice and other things and vice captains even Tommy Shane was there but, bless his little heartless self. And they gathered forth and they talked about the crime in Montrose. And the news media the next morning reported that everybody had thought it was lovely and thought that the real problem was prostitution and that the police were doing their job in that regard, and that they should stay out of dirty bookstores and concentrate on prostitution in Montrose. And so I thought that was bad enough, that was like, Monday, and then come Wednesday, I was doing a gig at a Political Caucus for the anti defamation committee and I left there for a little early for dinner. And I got into a little Chinese restaurant down here on the strip. And while I was trying to eat my sizzling rice soup, I looked up and lo and behold, there was like 10 uniformed police officers with nightsticks in their hands wandering down the street stopping everybody on everybody that they passed. I mean, it's like, like a dragnet. It was just amazing to see You've surely told me what dragnets were like. And so I guess that's what it was like, because I'd never been in one but they were just walking down the street and going between the buildings and the back alleys and all that and just covering the area like one line. And everybody they saw they stopped. And they demanded ID they searched some of the people. On least one occasion, they stopped two young men who were on their way to hide I found out later on the way to hungries for dinner, and after getting identification from them sent one down Westheimer in an easterly direction, and the other day on Westheimer, in a westerly direction with orders that they should go straight home and get to bed and get off the streets, which seems to be an unusual thing to do with a couple going to dinner. And then they swept by me in the Chinese restaurant and, and I'm too poor to throw away food. So I finished eating and then went out to see what I could do. And by that time they had reached the other end of Westheimer had no doubt all piled into their squad cars, six of which was caught in a traffic jam at the corner of Westheimer. And Taft Street. Anybody who's familiar with Westheimer knows that there's usually a traffic jam there. And six rod cars in one block. I counted them and they were making the circles and stopping people at random from the cars. I found two police officers parked over on Avondale doing a license search on a Porsche 924 that had been parked over there on a regular basis for the last two years. And as I stopped by this 11 s neighborhood and I said yes, sir, do you know anything about this car and I said no other than the right front wheel is bent from where it hit the curb when the lady that drives it parked it about six months ago and she hadn't had it fixed yet. And so then they continued their search of who that car belongs to. And that's where they I really don't know what they were doing. I really didn't get any reports of anyone arrested. But it was one of the most phenomenal things that I had seen. This all happened like last night. And Mike Bryan was

over from Austin to give me blow by blow details on the Austin election and all of that and Mike so used to be a volunteer here on the radio program and and so Mike and I decided we would go out and chase cops for the evening. So we went out and there were about three posses vice cops three each working on the street looking like vice cops. I think they were trying to pass off his hustlers. But I've never seen working hustlers carry carry on in threes with loose certs with their guns hidden, you know, and which makes it it's like having a nice pair of hips with a shear dress on, you're not really covering up and the gun would poke out every time they would gate and the vice officers on the beat have shiny shoes. And hustlers don't have shiny shoes. And vice officers on the beat hide their guns in the middle of their back and their shirts kind of flap up against it. So you get the whole outline, maybe a little exaggerated the gun, and so they're easy to point out and they weren't fooling anybody. So we walked around behind and laughed at them pointed at them and told anyone that didn't look like they belong to the neighborhood cops cops point point point cops, cops. And so they got tired of our harassing that and they got in the cars and drove off. And there were a few police officers and almost unmarked cars. I mean, we needed to big a couple of year old Plymouth with a little antenna on the back. It's not really an unmarked car at all one color hubcaps no wheel covers that sort of thing. But almost unmarked cars trying to pick up the the few young men that were standing presumably to wait on the bus. I didn't really think that any working hustler would have been on the streets after the earlier show of power. Nathan me working hustlers in Montrose anyway, I mean, it's strictly a buyers market, not a seller's market, but they're going to clean this up. And so they proceeded with their routine on that thing. And so about four o'clock this morning, I finally dragged into and gave up the ghost in the process of looking for the officers. Of course, when it comes shift change thing, there's one thing that most of you probably don't know about police behavior, and that is that shift chain shift change. That command right is a really important time to them. It's the opportunity for the people that have been on for eight hours to tell the war stories to the people that were coming on for the next eight hours. And in Houston Police Department that happens for higher ups at nine o'clock at night. And then the rank and file do it at some at 10 and some at 11. So from about quarter till 10 to 11:30 there ain't no cops available on the streets in the whole downtown area including Montrose they're just not they're all back at the police station, swapping union stories and plotting and planning on police chiefs and and giving one another answers to civil service tests so that they can get promotion and and telling [Worcester?], Oh, we really didn't to have hahaha over on Lyons Avenue tonight or Over on Montrose or over on Fulton Street. So the traffic died down and when the traffic died down from the police officers we looked up and here was this, this little Chevrolet running up down the streets very nervously and person driving it looked very much like Councilmember George Greanias, so we held it down and told him He, he could save his gas because the cops roll back the police station, he wanted to see cops that go down and look at it. And so we made a date with with George and this coming Saturday, we're going to kind of have a look at the situation and ride with a council member and show him some of the problems as they manifest in the neighborhood, impending doom, the much cursed accursed and frequently talked about evil, evil of the world, the circus club has been closed for a couple of three weeks. And it's going to open up according to its owner, Tony, this coming Friday, they have done whatever penance that they have been placed on doing. And so the circus club is going to open up this coming Friday. So I would imagine that that George and us are going to find the streets very interesting this Saturday, we would like to talk a little bit about defense mechanisms, unless you want to make an issue out of something and are willing to pay the ultimate cost and spend the night in jail. When stopped by a police officer and asked for identification. Show him some if you don't show him some and or if you don't have any. Or if you refuse to show him some identification, then he's probably going to arrest you though his doing so is going to be in contempt of a current standing federal order that they can't arrest you for refusing to document your identity. I mean, that's why I just got five grand from the city for it's because I

refuse your identity and carried it to the wall and the law doesn't exist. And the city's on our court ordered not to do that. But they still ask people for identification. And when you get stopped by a police officer go passive. Just you know, yes, sir. No, sir. Thank you, sir, please, and don't confront those people, they've known to be dangerous under those circumstances. And if you're out and about, especially in the Montrose area, this weekend, there's probably a pretty good chance you're gonna get stopped. Now, if they asked you for your work, you certainly don't have to tell them that. And I don't know of any charge of being arrested for refusal to identify source of income that went out with the vagrancy laws some years ago, and those were all unconstitutional. So you don't have to give them that kind of information, which you may be asked to document your identity. And if you want to make a point of it, go ahead and give me calls. And as you get to jail, my number is 523- 6969, we'll get down and get in touch with Judge Seals and see if we can't get the officer arrested for contempt. But you realize that when you do submit, and do something that's going to get you arrested, it's a long ride from Westheimer to 61 [Regional?] street, and they have crossed many bios and other dark places. So so before you decide to just become this great civil rights activist and stand up for that sort of thing. Think about the risk involved. Think about the personal commitment, you're probably going to have to at least temporarily get out either on your own volition, or with your own bread. And that's 200 bucks. So think about those things before you make that commitment. But if you do get stabbed and you get hassled, it doesn't make you mad enough to do something about it, write us a letter and address it to Wilde 'n' Stein. That's W-I-L-D-E, as an Oscar and Stein S-T-E-I-N, as in Gertrude, and send it to KPFT 419 Lovett Boulevard. And we'd be glad to add that to our collection of complaints against the Houston Police Department, we need to know the approximate time of the arrest what the officer look like and name, if you've got one. They take off their name badges a lot for that kind of operation. But if you've got a name or badge number, that would be nice to throw in, because that helps us track back the officer and keep a personal file on that officer. And it also gives us an accumulative account of what's going on in the community that does not result in someone actually being incarcerated. The legal definition of arrest is having your mobility stopped. So if you get stopped, you're under arrest. You may get shortly released thereafter. But if you get stopped and asked for ID, you actually have been arrested in contempt of that court. And we would like to have that story and know whether or not you'd like to pursue that. Of course, don't pick up any strangers on the street corner, which is kind of redundant. I don't really know that many gay people that do that anymore. They pick up friends with a street corner, it's not frequently strangers, especially if they get shiny shoes and funny bulges along their backbone. It is not true that all vice officers have hunched backs and fangs but a good many do so and that makes it easy to or if they're trying to pass themselves off as a hustler and they're in their late 40s Then you can figure that one out. Something's got to be wrong. Very hungry. And another routine that they've been able to been using recently is just absolutely insist that they are from out of town. They don't know what's going on in Houston and they would like for you a complete stranger on the street to get in their car and carry them someplace. That's not usually the waist trainers in the neighborhood as for direction, they usually know exactly where they're going, how to get to marriage, how do you get to nightside How do you get to twins? How do you get to kindred spirits? You know, giving people information but don't get in the car to do that. Because everybody that has been known to enter a car of that nature usually winds up at 61 reason the streets charged with prostitution where they're even thought about it in their whole lifetimes. And so that's the way that game goes. And that's the status of those police raids this weekend. But right in the middle of all of this in the last week, according to the Houston Chronicle today, there have been like three people employed by Houston Independent School District that have been accused of homosexual abuse of students. And, and celebration of such great success in the chicken hug squad. They had a press conference after the latter last one was arrested. And Johnny Freeman, you remember Johnny Freeman, we've been

talking about Johnny Freeman on this show for about five years, we first played a tape from him from some church of Christ, a gathering, where he talked about the real evil of homosexuals ruling the world by force and violence, because they weren't Church of Christ members, and a few gay members of the Church of Christ confronted them for debate and we wound up having to preachers once shipped in from Oklahoma somewhere wherever they make Church of Christ preachers. And we got in here we had that debate with Charles law I and two Church Christ ministers, which was bizarre, that that debate is still available. I think they play it on their cassette programming towards it's been severely edited, and we say nothing. They just say everything and don't have us saying anything. They've rearranged some of the things nice piece of editing. But it didn't write. Johnny Freeman had a press conference, and he told Houstonians, essentially, that the recent increase of homosexual abuse of students by instructors, was the fact that a lot of gay people go into teaching so they have ready access to young people to molest, and I know a lot of gay people that are teachers. And it occurs to me that if you're going to spend, at least for probably six or eight years, in educational preparation, your motive is not tricks. Your motive is something other than that. I don't know, anybody that would spend that much time in education in preparation for the availability of somebody to do that with the whole thesis that they present is is interesting. And you gotta realize that there's deceit there. Theses are not always that good. You remember on this program, we followed the disability cases and other cases to real close degree. And those cases were a group of counselors at a halfway house for young people that were all charged with homosexual conduct by the Chickenhawk Squad with the young people in that and it was discovered in their trial, that what device squad had done is taken young men and women in trouble in serious trouble with law young men and women who may be neath the age of consent, which is defined as whatever they wanted to find it as usually 17. And of those people were in serious trouble with the law having committed felony offenses and told them they would let them off those offenses if they would incriminate. The people attached to this halfway house, the sand dollar. And after a good bit of legal wrangling costs an enormous amount of money, the method that that came down, and the fact that all of their witnesses later testified that the Vice Squad taught them how to lie on the witness stand and say things that were not true so they could incriminate those people. So whenever you hear a news release, something of that nature that the Chickenhawk Squad has someone that is molested children, remember, those persons are not necessarily guilty as that is to be determined by court. The assumption of guilt on the Vice Squad comes from several mistaken things. In the first place. There are no gay people. As far as the Chickenhawk is concerned, under the age of consent, there are only rape victims under the age of consent. And those of you who are listening to this program who are 15 years old, you are not gay, according to the records from the Chickenhawk Squad, so they have that and other misconceptions. And what I think is going on is I think that what we're dealing with is a pretty sophisticated PR campaign. I think that the fact that Chickenhawk Squad is holding press conferences and talking about things and assuming guilt without any evidence. And I think that the meetings in City Hall get presented in the media in a very slanted way. Copy usually prepared by the police chief's press squad. I think that all of that is an indication that a lot of people that happened to be religious fanatics and right wing extremist and police officers are trying to convince Houston Houstonians that gay men and lesbians are something to be feared, and apparently Houstonians did not buy that in this last campaign. Apparently. This citizensof Austin are not buying that thesis which is being presented by religious fanatics over there. And so they're going to have to do something because they're behind in the PR battle. And what they're doing is telling lies about who I am, and telling lies about who you are and telling lies about who your friends are. And those lies are not going to work, because sooner or later, we will all declare that that is serious enough and sit down and come up with some kind of strategy to redress that. And the media is getting a little tired of the kinds of things that Johnny Freeman is saying, I noticed that in the print media, it did not come out at all. And I know the reporter

that did the story for Katie Erh. And I know why I did the story. Because if you listen to Johnny Freeman's voice, you could feel the presence of the absence of candor, his hate filters through his voice. And I find a lot of folk who fly into the color of religious fanatic organizations like the Church of Christ, frequently have their hate on their shoulder. And so while we're through with all of that depressing news, we're going to stick a little disco in your ear and we'll be right back with more stuff here on radio station KPFT and whose town it is five minutes past the hour, hanging around
