And yeah, in what do you how can you get something good out of this. And one of the things that kind of, kind of came across long ago was, you know, in ancient Greece, they used to have theater. And basically, when people went to see tragedies, they weren't a passive audience, they would pull out their hair, they bang on the ground, they just rant and rave and just get into it in a very big way. And the Greeks had a word for it, it was called catharsis. And in modern day, we really don't have a good avenue for really good catharsis. But I think BDSM kind of serves that role, where we can kind of get into the darker side of ourselves and then explored and express it and let it come out. And, and just it's kind of like venting and all this stuff out. It can be a very powerful thing. So anyway, with that, I'm just kind of wanting to kick things off. Michelle, I know that you've been very involved can you tell us a little bit about your experiences but as the top and his bottom and what you get out of it?

Well, I mean, that's sort of something that I've been exploring a lot here in Seattle. Let me try and think about what the different experiences are well as a bottom start from there definitely definitely a sense of there's there's that aspect of catharsis like of anything that you know causes you know, the idea of like pain which causes endorphins arise which can lead to altered states similar to any other technique used to gain altered states such as meditation or ritual or things like that. And by using you know, the technique of BDSM by through through beatings or pain or other things like that one can reach a lot of those same altered states that you can reach through other methods and that can be really helpful in terms of getting stuff out that your rational day to day mind is preventing from coming out for whatever reason, and I definitely have had things get released like just feelings of you know, emotions being led out stuff like that. And there's also the idea of pushing limits you know, of like learning that your body can do things that you didn't think it could do and you know you're like and you know, by taking some some stretching yourself in some way you know, you really can have this experience of this feeling of like well, I you know, have broken this limit about myself now, what else can I do? You know, that kind of thing I can translate into other aspects of your life talking about being a top just sort of like for me, like the experience of being a top taking, like taking some of that stuff that I think of as you know, my dark side like things is about like, you know, things that I would normally tend to rein in like, you know, like, desires like to, you know, cause pain or other aspects of like that, and using it for some good purpose using it for helping someone else break their limits, and, you know, discovering new things about themselves or having or just pleasure, you know, just for the sheer pleasure of it. I mean, when you pain can release endorphins, you know, it can lead to a high similar to what you get from like morphine, for

instance. And, you know, have those that can be like a very pleasurable experience, you know, it's using your own body's natural responses to create states of pleasure that you couldn't get otherwise.

There's a power that's transferred. When infants are born, if they don't receive human touch, they die. And whatever we exchanged through touch, it's very powerful. When you arrive at a size it and put it into different contexts, then that can amplify whatever is the exchanges when we touch.

Yeah, it's really helpful, I think, I think, for me, it was one of the things that was really helpful is experiencing, you know, power exchange in a sacred way. Because most of us, you know, experienced power exchange, in dominance and submission, you know, a lot of us like, in our jobs, or whatever, in a very non sacred or way, you know, or you have, like a boss who, you, you know, tells you what to do, and, and all this kind of stuff, you know, but like in a DNS in a healthy DNS relationship, you know, it's very different, because you have the idea of, you know, the submissive, giving up this power, but also the dominant and turn having all these duties, you know, having this responsibility. Yeah. And the other thing I'd kind of like to throw in is that there, you know, we've kind of touched on it a little bit, but there's many different forms of BDSM play. Even the initials, you know, bondage and discipline or, or dominance and submission, or sadomasochism are all kind of different aspects of BDSM. And each one is a little bit different. And even under each one, you have subtle differences. So you want to be real clear with who you're playing with, what's going to happen and what kind of things you want to get into. You know, when scenes, I've seen a few scenes go wrong, and a lot of times when they go wrong, it's because there hasn't been good, clear communications. But anyway, I kind of want to take a look at some of the things that for me, have been really intense, and share a little bit. I know that being a hermaphrodite, and having doctors having performed certain surgeries on my body without my consent as an infant I left a lot of damage. And I think another aspect of BDSM for me is that not only is it a spiritual process, but it's also a spiritual healing process. I went through a very powerful ritual, where I had a piercing gun in my penis. And you know, throughout the entire ritual, we set the intent and basically I was symbolically replacing a hole that was taken away from me. And basically, when I got into the scene, and we, you know, there's some warm up and, and I was kind of a little nervous at first, I've heard a lot of stuff like, oh, this can really be painful. And this can sometimes there's a lot of bleeding when you do a reverse Prince Albert piercing. And it's amazing some of the dynamics that can occur, I felt no pain throughout the whole process. But it was done in sacred space, and in his in his spirituals, was spiritual intent. And as the needle went through, she didn't just one shot through, it kind of went about a third of the way than two thirds. And then then she finally pushed it all the way out. The only time I felt even the slightest amount of pain was when the needle actually exited. And it was a curved needle also, just the tip exited out and, and it was a slow piercing it when done very fast. And I tell you, I just started flying and it just felt so incredibly power empowering to kind of actualize this symbol, and make it a part of my a part of my body that had been mutilated. And it became very intense and very healing and deeply spiritual for me. When we get into something like that, you know, I took several weeks working with the person did the actual ritual with me, did the actual piercing. And we went and we researched everything on, you know, on piercings and where to get the proper equipment and what precautions we need to take and how to keep everything antiseptic really clean. So we did a lot of research long before we even got to the ritual stage. And, and it was like two weeks, you know, spent hours and hours researching this stuff, while actually the both of this together. And then we set the stage. And when it happened, it was just an amazing, incredibly amazing experience. I think that's part of for me, setting intent, it's like and it can the intent doesn't have to be something really major major like that. It can be any number of things and know that I had some problems growing up you know, I was kind of the black sheep of my family. So I went through some healing rituals using BDSM in that regard to so it can be you know, very small things or very big things. Sometimes it's for me, it's just a way of really getting in touch with the inner child getting in touch with that part of me that doesn't want to be in control that want someone else to be in control for a while and to take me someplace and all that when I play a really good scene all the good scenes I've played have always been well negotiated with the person I'm playing with
