Joe Stephen was a star athlete singer and student at the US Naval Academy at Annapolis at 22. He was selected as a battalion commander, making him one of the Academy's 10 highest ranking midshipmen. He was also selected for the Navy's elite nuclear power program for submarine officers. Two months before his graduation in 1987, Stephen learned that the naval investigative service was looking into allegations that he was gay. He confronted the

Academy's administration concerning the investigation and came out based solely on his own admission, and with no evidence of any actual sexual conduct, Stefan was forced to resign from the academy, Stephen talks about His coming out process with Todd Wilson.

I know that I've been gay all my life. And it's much easier for me to recognize that I was gay, even before I consciously accepted it. I think that our minds are extremely powerful. I was in a very conservative environment. And don't doubt there were a lot of things going on in my inside my head that were simply repressed. And so I have no question that my sexuality is as innate a trait and is unchangeable a trade as the color of my eyes in something that we don't have any choice over. And I think that the advancement of understanding in that regard will only help us gain the rights and equality that we've been searching for.

Basically, the Reader's Digest version, then military has determined through its own studies that the median coming out age, if you will, is about age 20. So when I was actually 20, I guess I came out to myself I began to resolve the confusion or ambiguities that I had, and I accepted the reality that what I was feeling was attraction to other men. And I worked to to increase my own acceptance of my sexuality. I eventually decided during my senior year to come out to to friends, and apparently, whether it was malicious or unintentional, that information was leaked, and an investigation was started. And it was based on that investigation that I was actually as a result of that investigation that I decided to confront the administration. And I was asked, Are you gay and I have responded truthfully, that I am and it was based on that, based solely on that statement. I am gay, that I was discharged from the military and I have since file a lawsuit overturn the policy.

I'm really, I guess, I'm

happy with the book because it has many different facets. And it not only talks about unique and mysterious institution, it underlies a common experience of all gay men and lesbians, the process of coming out in a context, I think, which is very unusual.

I think I would, I think it would be interesting. And I wouldn't be the only gay person in the military, which is what people often overlook. The reality is unlike the integration of blacks and women into the military, that there are already as many gay men and lesbians in the military as there ever will be. And the military admits, even in its own studies that about 10% of the military is gay. So what we're really talking about is not integration. We're talking about simply accepting the reality that we're already there.

as I have said, and will continue to say, to my dying day, the ultimate thing that anyone can do, is to be visible. If you look over the history of the gay and lesbian movement, nothing has been gained, that hasn't been gained through visibility. People often try and convince us that our goal should be not to challenge society's stereotypes and ignorance, but to simply try and assimilate, to quietly assimilate into society and to just sort of be hidden. I think we learned as a result of the AIDS crisis, that quiet assimilation gains us nothing, and that if we remain invisible, then people will never question the stereotypes that are that they are confronted with. When we're out to our friends, and we're out to our family. And we're out. As much as we can be out. People will see that the stereotypes in the ignorance are false. They will see us for who we are and for what we are, and will realize that we're just people like they are. And when the day comes, that we are all able to be visible, we will have the equality, and we have the acceptance that we've been fighting for.
