And she admits quite openly in this book, she says, I've never worked the streets, I've never had to worry about cops. I always had, you know, good clients and was able to screen and stuff like that. So she admits she had she wasn't in the, you know, rough part of being a prostitute. But um, so it seems like the books you get are, are so one sided. And that was really interesting about this one, because you did see some of the bad side and you did see some of the good side. And another interesting thing is that some of these people like Hartley or queen, or Jill Nagel, or somebody like that are writers, you know, and very literate. And some of them, you'll look in the back and they have a list of contributors and authors and things like that. And quite a few of them, it's just basically so and so he lives in New York, New York, which probably means these people you know, we're like off the streets and stuff like that.
