And she will run a workshop explaining to everyone what the guy's been gay rights lobby, Texas is planning on doing and how they need everyone's help. That workshop will be held in conjunction with an extremely short meeting of the caucus. And the meeting will take place at the Metropolitan Community Church of the resurrection, which is located at 1919. Decatur, just south of Washington, at White. So this is something where everybody can come back and give their thoughts, they can find out what they can do to help support the fight against the anti gay adoption bill. Now the thing that's interesting about this is about to file is that they did some work, and they looked at focus groups that are who's interested in fighting this anti gay adoption ban. And I found that while most of the gay men just don't have that much interest in children are having children or ever think that they're going to have children because of their lifestyle. However, if this bill passes, if they are in a family, and let's say their sister or brother have children, and they have had an accident, and they die, and they've left their care of the children to their brother, this bill will stop. It will make it impossible for a gay man to even adopt blood relatives, even if those blood relatives have put down and their will that the children are to go to them for care. So a gay man can't adopt his niece or nephew. If this bill passes, so it's something that's going to affect all of us.
