Now, Ruston is widely credited with making that event, one of the watershed moment movements of the civil rights era. That's where King had his I Have a Dream speech. And fittingly, it was also the model for both the 1993 Gay and Lesbian march in Washington, and the Million Man watch in 95. And so as we celebrate Martin Luther King Day, let's remember that one of his chief aides was an out and proud black gay activist.

Last weekend, two people were robbed and assaulted at the corner of Hyde Park and grand which is right behind the bird down heaven. And so hate crime reporting. I mean, we want to stop hate crimes, but hate crime reporting is one of those ways that we can do that. The main way that anyone can report a hate crime is to call the hate crimes hotline. That's a nonprofit service offered by the gay and lesbian switchboard of Houston. They deserve our support. And they're providing a forum for crimes perpetrated against members of the gay, lesbian, bisexual and transgender community. They log these they tedium And they report them, they go into the federal numbers. So this is a service that you could that they provide for us to count the numbers. And if you are a victim or no victim of a hate crime, you can call area code 713-529-9615. Now, I will also offer again, since we're having since the numbers are very, very low on reporting versus what actually happens. If anyone has some ideas on how to stop hate crimes, or how to improve on the reporting of hate crimes. They can call queue patrol. Leave a message on the queue patrol voicemail, I will get the message. I do the queue patrol voicemail So the Q Patrol number is area code 713528. Safe. That's 5287233. Now I want to go on to the court news, real quick. The court had its coronation. The court, by the way, is the Royal Sovereign imperial court of the single star Incorporated, of Houston. And there was really only one position that had been voted on. And remember, the voting is by the community, everyone had a chance last Saturday go out and vote. And the community voted for Empress, Jennifer Ellsworth, so she will be Emperor 14. There were a lot of awards handed out and a lot of things, very nice things said about everyone in the community. And also, she was recognized for being one of two people who have ever exceeded the \$5,000 individual raising of money. Within the court system, well, she did that on her own.
