guess you'd call him a sexologist or something back in like the 50s and 60s and stuff. He was talking about homosexuality and trans sexuality and all this stuff. very favorably. And, but he's also the guy who came up with the idea of quote unquote, fixing intersex children at birth or immediately thereafter. His theory was, first of all that a child can be the gender is fluid up until the age of about two years old, two and a half, something like that. And also, he said that intersex kids, if they're born with ambiguous genitals need to be fixed because if not, they're gonna have massive, massive psychosocial problems. So that was that was his theory. Back in, like I say, the 50s and 60s, which has now spread to just about every single country in the world that intersex children are operated on to look more like either boys or girls that well, back in 1967 there was a case that came up twin brothers, one of whom had his penis burned off in a circumcision accident. And you can see you know, I mean complete looking exactly like a girl here little dress the curly hair and everything like that. So this case was made very famous because money never referred to the kids by name but in everything he wrote from then on and still he still maintains this that it was successful little girl grew up and perfect little daddy's girl and very delicate and feminine likes to play with her little dollies and her tea sets and and her twin brothers just as boyish as can be and like to play with his trucks and stuff like that. So he he used this one case to prove that it was the gender was completely nurture over nature had nothing to do with how you were born had nothing to do with it. It just had to do with how the child was raised.
