And I said, Well, it's yes or no. I said it all depends. I'm 46 I've known a lot of bisexual guys who've been married. Everyone that I've known, who's kept their bisexuality, a secret from their spouse had a miserable marriage, and every one of them ended in divorce. I've known a lot of guys who were upfront from the get go even while they were dating with their bisexuality, and they've had successful marriages. And so the key here, for bisexuality is well is for gay and heterosexuality. Be honest with the other person. If your marriage is going to start on a foundation of distrust and dishonesty, it's doomed to failure.
