According to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, while 85% said they had oral sex without a condom, because they believe it was little risk for transmission. Transmission of HIV virus. Wrong favor. Okay. The CDC study conducted by Dr. Beth Dillon, in collaboration with the University of California, San Francisco's options project surveyed 102 gay and bisexual men who recently had become infected with HIV. Of the 102 participants. Eight or actually 7.8% appear to have been infected through oral sex. Oral sex is a lower risk than receptive anal intercourse. But because it is low risk doesn't mean it can result in infection. You can't put oral sex on the same level as mutual masturbation, for example, said Dr. Richard Validus, airy, the CDC is National Center for HIV STD and TB prevention. So apparently where we've always thought the that HIV was Not necessarily through oral sex, they're starting to figure that more people are doing that as because people are not using the condoms.
