To judge by the Glee at the White House Office of National Drug Control Policy, the drug warriors have just accomplished the moral equivalent of routing the Taliban, helping to halt a relentless jihad against the nation's drug loss. The truly amazing thing is that 30 years again, 30 years for our side, into the modern war on drugs, the discourse is still focused disproportionate disproportionately on marijuana.
