And it's a beautiful card. And the quote says the important thing is not that we can live on hope alone. But that life is not worth living. Without it. You know, we've been doing this program for over three years. And in the beginning, we started out very much on our own alone, not knowing where we were going, or what we were going to do. And over the years, we've come to understand one thing. And that is, I am no different than you go to work, have friends have a family. I did find out three years ago how wonderful it was, and what it meant to be gay and proud, all at the same time. And we don't come down here to impress you, or ourselves or any group, political or religious, or whatever. We're not here for anybody. We're here to tell you that there is hope. And although I've been called a fool, and there are those who continue to try to hurt me, both mentally, and thank God, not physically, I can only tell them that they are the ones who are hurting. Because I do believe that our hope will become a reality. And I do believe that if we can watch the Berlin Wall come down the walls that surround and confine and strangle us, the scale has been people, the walls, bigotry, the walls of hatred, the walls of injustice will come down and we will see it. Please, we've got to quit hurting each other have to work together. That's the message that we screamed and preached for three years. And it seems like the more we scream, we got to work together, the more they try to hurt us. I don't understand it. But all I can tell them is that we're still here. And we're still queer. And we'll be back week after week when you peak after peak of dramatic excitement. I stole that. From an old Big Valley Big Belly big battle and a promo on television years ago that I just I don't know I'm angry this morning. I'm angry at those people who continue to ignore us because as I stood on that quilt, baby, you have to see it. You have to see the tremendous force that's there that made something so beautiful. And we can't just let it die. We can't ignore it. We have to get it off that floor and wrap it around us and take it to our jobs and our churches and our schools. Merchants where we spend our money. They have to under not understand who we are and what we are and then we're never ever going to sit down on the back of the bus and be quiet again.
