And that's at the counseling and education building located at 1010 Law. So you can call the 24 hour crisis hotline, rape crisis hotline, and that's 713528 rate. That's 5287273. Or you can call the 24 hour domestic violence and information referral hotline 713-528-2121 as five to 821 21. The center provides short term emergency shelter for men as well. And all

services are free of charge in 1997. They provide a counseling and support for more than 400 Male survivors survivors of sexual assault and domestic violence. And I just also wanted to mention that they have a new manager for the non residential Children's Services. So they provide services for children, ages four to 18, their parents, siblings and caregivers with individual group counseling, and so they have a full range of services. And it's available to men in the queer community. Yes, men in the queer community have children and have children but
