And just folks that they didn't know but they knew had died of AIDS that also made panels and we started sticking all these together. And now it's so big, we can't even lay it all down in one place. So on Columbus Day weekend, in October, on the sixth through the eighth, we're going to lay 19 120 panels of the names project quilt down in Houston. They were also African, it's significant because in March or in October of 1987, when we went to Washington, DC for the second march on Washington for gay and lesbian rights, we laid down 19 120 panels on the Capitol Mall. So we're gonna lay down 19 120 panels in the George R brown Convention Center, and you will come down and see it. So just mark it down on your calendar. I don't want to have to come out into the woodlands and get you and drag you down here kicking you in the rear end to see the damn quilt because you will come see it. So just write it down. In your calendar child, you're coming to see it. But the reason this is special this time is because there will also be 19 120 panels lying on the ground in Atlanta, and Chicago, and Los Angeles and Washington DC. This particular weekend, we're going to do something that we've never done with the quilt before it will be on view in five cities at the same time. And each of the five cities will be connected via satellite. And monitors will be set up, for example in the Brown Center, so that we can see what's going on with the quilt in Washington and Chicago and Atlanta and Los Angeles.
