I inadvertently discovered your show when I left my radio tuned to KPFT prison show. Previously I'm at a unit that just says in the Department of Criminal Justice. Yeah. He's not asking money or anything like that though. He just has a story to tell that he wants to be anonymous about. So this is Rex's story. Before I begin, I want you to know, some of my demographics. I was a middle aged closeted, gay white man, working at two prominent colleges here in Texas. One as a staff member, one as an evening college instructor both for many years. I kept my gay lifestyle out of my public life, even my family had no knowledge. Only with the advent of the internet did I begin meeting those similarly natured even now here in prison, my identity is guarded. For I could suffer physical harm due to my true charges and lifestyle. It is paramount that you honor my request and keep my secret at keep my secret as is and use the alias mentioned. History begins with him logging on to gay dot coms local chat room for the area. He was placed into a private chat, by what by when I was told to be an 18 year old guy. We had similar interests and nothing seemed out of the ordinary. He wanted to go down too low. He wanted to date an older guy, and I was certainly willing. So he instructed me where to meet him. It was a public park not far from the university campus. I went to the park and found him where he said he would be. Again nothing seemed out of the ordinary. Since I was a college Instructure instructor his physical stature and amenities were like those of my students. He and I had sex in a secluded part of the park. However, while doing so, two young children boys walked up on us. And the guy in him quickly departed and went his way and him and I went mine. However, during our exit, he asked me to return the next day to talk, I agreed. When I arrived the next day, I was met and questioned by a police detective. However, nothing about what could be said of a sexual assault, just routine questions. The other guy never came. I left but for some reason, I felt uncomfortable. My fears were founded, because later that evening, I was arrested for sexual assault of a child under 17. It was then that I learned that the guy was with the previous day was 15. Try to see if it's coming from the microphone over.

And I thought surely hotmail.com was reputable enough so and I agreed to meet his appearance was that of the previous guy only more so. After a week or so of exchanging emails, we went on a date which resulted in gay sex afterwards. We only had one such date but exchanged numerous emails, mostly me answering questions he posed as a relatively inexperienced gay man. The result of my arrest was I was charged with sexual assault of a child under 17. Two separate indictments. Since the second young man was 16 and a half years old. I had the option of a trial or to plea bargain. Since there was no defense for this type of charge in Texas, I decided not to publicly embarrass either young man, an option to sign a plea. I was given two sentences of 12 years each. However, the judge ran them concurrently. I can't come up for parole this year. I sincerely hope to go home. But it's not likely parole of a sex offender is not often done, especially when the media places so much emphasis on story of child abuse or sexual assault. What really saddens me is that I'm classified as a child predator, which I would never do. I would be belittled and chastised to no end being subjected to constant monitoring and registration for life. Today, sexual assault offenses are death sentences and inmates are ridiculed by other inmates all the time. tdcj Texas Department criminal justice had to group sex offenders at special units to safeguard them. Many sexual offenders have been attacked or killed. I write you today not asking for your Mercy and understanding, but to ask you to warn your listeners of the perils that are out there, especially if one meets another person on the net. I would appreciate your prayers on my release, I will continue to listen to your lively discussions, even though sometimes you guys make me wish I had someone to hold in love. Maybe one day, maybe until such time keep it hard and protected. Don't assume anything. Prison is not cool.
