**JIMMY CARPER:** Yeah.

**JIMMY CARPER:** Hey.

**DJ:** --who's supported and who's listened.

**JIMMY CARPER:** You do good music.

**DJ:** Thank you.

**JIMMY CARPER:** Yeah, I really like it. Let me tell you, coming home from the airport with all the traffic and the congestion in the roads going, it's just really nice to just tune in to your show.

**DJ:** Well, I appreciate that. Thank you very, very much.

**JIMMY CARPER:** I hope you get to have six more and six more after that.

**DJ:** We'll see. We'll see how it goes.

**JIMMY CARPER:** OK.

**DJ:** Thank you very much, Jimmy.

**JIMMY CARPER:** You bet. And now for something very, very different.

[THEME MUSIC]

Hello, Houston, and College Station, and Huntsville, and welcome to *After Hours*, queer radio with attitude on KPFT Houston and KEOS College Station. I'm Jimmy Carper, and this is the April 28th edition. I'm out of breath, yes. Just got back from the airport. Stanley's gone for another several weeks, and so I'm all alone.

**JACKIE** You're single?

**THORNE:**

**JIMMY CARPER:** Well, I don't want to go that far.

**JACKIE** OK.

**THORNE:**

**JIMMY CARPER:** Let's see, Jackie Thorne is with me. We're going to do a couple of little things here before we bring HATCH on.

And this is going to be a fun time because HATCH is talking about prom night, and that's occurring next weekend right here. And in fact, those of you who get the Sunday Chronicle, we can read about it on the front page, the HATCH Prom. It's right there.

But let's see, a couple of things I want to say. I want to remind folks that coming up starting May the 10th will be our spring marathon. And so for that two weeks, we'll be asking for your contributions of support for *After Hours* and KPFT. And let's see, there's a whole bunch of other stuff going on here.

I got some information about the Court, and that of course, every Sunday night at the BRB is a show hosted by John Carter. And this weekend, it's going to be with Crystal Reilly Love, and it's going to be in the memory of Dave Jordan, who died last month. He was a member of the Colts and the Court. And his husband, Jim Vocahn--

**JACKIE** [? Vocan. ?]

**THORNE:**

**JIMMY CARPER:** [? Vocan. ?] Thank you-- was the past president of the Colts. And we missed, just missed, the Saturday show at Chances that was hosted by Ronnie and Cheyenne, right? And you were there, Jackie.

**JACKIE** Right.

**THORNE:**

**JIMMY CARPER:** How was it?

**JACKIE** It was fun. We had about 12 entertainers, and--

**THORNE:**

**JIMMY CARPER:** Oh, that's nice.

**JACKIE** --we ran two sets. It ran for about two hours. I left before we got a final count, but it looked like they had a fair

**THORNE:** amount of money there.

**JIMMY CARPER:** Good. Good, good, good, and next weekend, there's going to be a chili cook off? Am I reading correctly?

**JACKIE** Mm-hmm.

**THORNE:**

**JIMMY CARPER:** Wow. Where's that going to be? He said he may--

**JACKIE** I'm thinking it's going to be at Chances.

**THORNE:**

**JIMMY CARPER:** Yeah? And if it isn't, he's going to reschedule it.

**JACKIE** Mm-hmm.

**THORNE:**

**JIMMY CARPER:** Then Sunday night is the Cinco de Mayo--

**JACKIE** Cinco de Mayo.

**THORNE:**

**JIMMY CARPER:** --pageant. Cinco de Mayo pageant. Viva La Diva benefit, and coronation, and Miss Regina Dayne. And let me tell you, anything that Miss Regina Dane is involved in is going to be--

**JACKIE** First class.

**THORNE:**

**JIMMY CARPER:** --first class, you bet. You bet I have utmost respect for her. And you were talking about something going on.

**JACKIE** Yeah, tomorrow night at the Briar Patch.

**THORNE:**

**JIMMY CARPER:** Good old Briar.

**JACKIE** Yeah, Holcombe and Greenbriar. At 9 o'clock is the Miss and the first Mr. Honeybee contest, which is basically

**THORNE:** sponsored by the Garden Party. But just about everybody that's a member of the Garden Party is also a member of the Court, so.

**JIMMY CARPER:** So, yeah.

**JACKIE** Yeah, one of those things, but it should be a real interesting contest. And it's a lot of fun. It's kind of a campy

**THORNE:** type thing.

**JIMMY CARPER:** Good.

**JACKIE** But it's a lot of fun.

**THORNE:**

**JIMMY CARPER:** And that's a great group over there.

**JACKIE** Oh, yeah, and Briar Patch is one of the nicest bars.

**THORNE:**

**JIMMY CARPER:** It really, really is.

**JACKIE** I deal blackjack on Friday night. So y'all want to find a real nice place on a Friday night, come down there about

**THORNE:** 9:30. I'm there from 9:30, 12:30. It's for play--

**JIMMY CARPER:** Yeah.

**JACKIE** --or practice. You can practice for going over in Louisiana. And maybe if we get lucky, up to Alabama-Coushatta

**THORNE:** Indians in a little bit. But it's a lot of fun, and the money goes to the Court.

**JIMMY CARPER:** Good.

**JACKIE** The buy in is \$5, and I've got a little coupon gizmo going now, where you get an extra 1,000 chip. You get 5,000

**THORNE:** chips for your \$5, and then you get an extra 1,000 chips plus you get your first well drink at happy hour prices and a coupon.

**JIMMY CARPER:** Hey, can't beat that.

**JACKIE** Yeah.

**THORNE:**

**JIMMY CARPER:** Great, so that's every Friday night?

**JACKIE** That's every Friday night, yeah.

**THORNE:**

**JIMMY CARPER:** And Sunday night will be a fun time.

**JACKIE** Sunday night will be a real fun time. Y'all really need to get out for that.

**THORNE:**

**JIMMY CARPER:** You don't even have to know anybody to walk in there and have fun. Because I'm not a bar goer, and I go to different fundraisers there. And it's just family when you walk in. It's great.

**JACKIE** Yeah. Well, the other thing, too, that people may not be aware of is that during the week, like Tuesday,

**THORNE:** Wednesday, Thursday, Friday, Saturday, they have the piano sing-along. They've got a big grand piano with a big sheet of plastic on top of the thing, a thick plastic gizmo that you can put your drinks and stuff on. And everybody gathered around, and they've got different piano players, and they do a lot of Broadway songs.

**JIMMY CARPER:** --on Wednesday, isn't she? Marcy Rae is on Wednesday.

**JACKIE** Marcy Rae's on Wednesdays. Wayne is usually there on Friday nights, and then there's somebody else that

**THORNE:** comes in late on Friday night that plays. But it's a lot of fun. Everybody sings along, and it doesn't matter whether you can carry a tune in a bucket or not.

**JIMMY CARPER:** OK, one more thing before we get to the music for HATCH. And today, I believe, it was the sale for the Divas?

**JACKIE** Yeah, the Divas, [? Stagedoor ?] Divas had their rummage sale, and we raised over \$600 on that.

**THORNE:**

**JIMMY CARPER:** Hey.

**JACKIE** That will be split-- well, actually, we'll accumulate it because we've got several other things coming up. But we'll

**THORNE:** accumulate it, and it'll be split. Half of it will go to Aids Foundation Stone Soup, which provides the nonperishable food for the Stone Soup Food Pantry. And the other half will go to the Colt 45 Stone Soup, which provides the perishables, meat, vegetables, milk, what have you.

**JIMMY CARPER:** Yeah.

**JACKIE** But the [? Stagedoor ?] Divas, in addition to the garage sale that we had, will have a diva show that's coming up

**THORNE:** and the date escapes me. But we also have the Tony Awards party at the Briar Patch on the Sunday night, the first Sunday in June. So, and we'll have televisions all over the place so you can watch it. We have a contest. You try and pick the different categories, and whoever guesses the most of them, gets a little prize. And then we'll have some other stuff going on as well.

**JIMMY CARPER:** That sounds like fun.

**JACKIE** It is. It's a lot of fun.

**THORNE:**

**JIMMY CARPER:** OK, we'll get more information on that. Right now, it's time to get to HATCH music and get these folks in here.

[MUSIC PLAYING]

You open the mic and you said, gee, that's not the song I wanted to play. Turn down the volume, and then you hit this little button over here, and it opens it up, and then you close it back again, and then you flip on the number you want. Go ahead, turn the dial.

**TOMMY:** And this all on air while you--

**JIMMY CARPER:** Yeah, that's the way, and then you hit-- no, no, no, no, you hit Enter.

**TOMMY:** Oh, Enter, hmm?

**JIMMY CARPER:** Yeah.

**TOMMY:** I knew all that stuff.

**JIMMY CARPER:** Henter.

**TARA:** Ah, you guys know that you cut off the music so we can hear you, right?

**JIMMY CARPER:** Yeah, right.

**TOMMY:** Ah, I didn't push the Enter button.

**JIMMY CARPER:** OK, so, now, that's four. You want five, don't you?

**TOMMY:** I want three.

**JIMMY CARPER:** Three? [LAUGHS] Three, enter that--

**TOMMY:** And play.

**JIMMY CARPER:** --and then, all right. And then, you go here.

**TOMMY:** Pause.

**JIMMY CARPER:** --and, yeah. And then you put the volume back up, and then you hit Play.

**TOMMY:** Yeah, because [INAUDIBLE].

**JIMMY CARPER:** There you go.

**TOMMY:** All right, welcome to HATCH and stuff. Yeah, I knew that, too.

[MUSIC PLAYING]

**TARA:** Tommy!

**TOMMY:** It didn't stop, Jimmy. Hey, stop.

**JIMMY CARPER:** Welcome to HATCH porn show.

[LAUGHTER]

**TARA:** Yeah.

**TOMMY:** Yeah.

**JIMMY CARPER:** Can I get a chicka-bow-bow?

**TOMMY:** Boom-chika-ow-ow.

[LAUGHTER]

I'm Tommy. That was Savage Garden, part of the first song, and then part of the third song, and a lot of Jimmy and I talking.

**JIMMY CARPER:** And a bunch of skipping.

**TOMMY:** Yeah. What was the name [INAUDIBLE]?

**JIMMY CARPER:** Skippity, do, da.

**TOMMY:** I have no idea what the name of that song is. I want to stand with you-- no, I want to stand with you on a mountain or something or other. Oh, no. But I just know our freshman year, Liz? Rachel, do you remember Rachel?

**LIZ:** Rachel?

**TOMMY:** I loved Rachel. She moved away to Boston or something.

**LIZ:** Oh, Rachel, yeah.

**JUSTIN:** So now I hate her.

[LAUGHTER]

**TOMMY:** No, I have her picture on my wall. But anyway, her, Devon, and somebody else was singing that for a like pop show or something. Yeah.

**LIZ:** That's cool.

**TOMMY:** And I remember them practicing it all the time. And so every time I hear it, I think of Rachel. So, yeah. Hi, Rachel in Boston.

[LAUGHTER]

**JIMMY CARPER:** Speaking of which, may I ask you something?

**TOMMY:** Go ahead.

**JUSTIN:** Speaking of witches.

**JIMMY CARPER:** You were going to do sing a song for-- what's in your show?

**JUSTIN:** Senior Spotlight.

**TARA:** It was so cute.

**JUSTIN:** I totally--

**LIZ:** Oh, yeah

**JUSTIN:** --knocked down everybody else that was there. I was the best. Mm-hmm.

**LIZ:** He was. It was great.

**JIMMY CARPER:** OK, now, let's hear it from someone else.

**TOMMY:** OK, everybody else was here.

**TARA:** What really happened was--

**LIZ:** It was great.

**JUSTIN:** OK, well I knocked on everybody at the Senior showcase. I was the best. Mm-hmm.

**TOMMY:** Good job, Justin.

**TARA:** I took many pictures of you accidentally in panoramic view.

**JUSTIN:** Tara does not know how to use the panoramic camera.

**TARA:** But none of them come out and all you can see is JV baseball caps on the back of your JV baseball players.

**JIMMY CARPER:** OK, why did you take pictures of the baseball players?

**JUSTIN:** They were sitting in front of us.

**TARA:** That's the only part that the flash like illuminated.

**JUSTIN:** As long it was the backs of the JV baseball players.

**JIMMY CARPER:** So how was the performance?

**JUSTIN:** By the way, JV doesn't stand for junior varsity. Jersey Village.

**JIMMY CARPER:** Oh, wow.

**TARA:** Go, JV! Woo-hoo!

**TOMMY:** We were at the [INAUDIBLE].

**JUSTIN:** What? Say that one more time.

**JIMMY CARPER:** So how was the performance?

**TARA:** It was excellent.

**JUSTIN:** I did so good.

**LIZ:** It was.

**JIMMY CARPER:** What did you do?

**JUSTIN:** I sang a song by Blue October, and it's called "Balance Beam".

**TARA:** I'm sure we put it here like a million times.

**JIMMY CARPER:** Yes.

**LIZ:** Yes.

**TOMMY:** Yes.

**JUSTIN:** I like that song a lot so I play it.

**TOMMY:** It's the theme song.

**JUSTIN:** There's no Blue October tonight. How about that?

**JIMMY CARPER:** Oh.

**JUSTIN:** My little sister has the CD. Yeah, and then like the new one got stolen from me. Someone's going to get a beat down. Mm-hmm.

**TARA:** Who stole it from you?

**JUSTIN:** I have no idea.

**BRENDAN:** It could have been anyone. Everyone wants Blue October.

**JUSTIN:** Mm-hmm. Oh, yes.

**TARA:** Who was that random voice? Is there someone I don't see?

**JUSTIN:** Hey, well, why don't we get into introduction of HATCH and everything. And then, we can introduce everything and Tara will know who's here, and headphones will stop hurting her hair, and yeah. OK, so this is the HATCH segment of *After Hours*.

HATCH stands for a Houston Area Teen Coalition of Homosexuals. We meet every Friday nights and every Sunday nights. Fridays starting at 7, Sundays starting at 6:00. To be in HATCH, you must be 20-- well, 13 to 20, yeah.

**TOMMY:** 20 to 45.

[LAUGHTER]

**JUSTIN:** The number to HATCH, if you would like to get involved, is 713-942-7002. Oh, good job for pointing that out, Tara.

**TARA:** Yeah.

**JUSTIN:** Yeah!

**TARA:** Hell yeah! I got it over here written down.

**TOMMY:** Oh, please don't scream. Please.

**JUSTIN:** Did I ask you?

**TOMMY:** I'm talking to Tara.

**LIZ:** All right, let's move on.

**TARA:** I'm getting a little tired of your attitude tonight.

**TOMMY:** Well, at least you're across the glass this time.

**TARA:** [CLEAR THROAT]

**TOMMY:** Well, OK, I'm Tommy. I will be hosting tonight like I do every month. Today, I have Tara co-hosting with me.

**TARA:** Hi.

**TOMMY:** So, that's Tara. Who have we got on the other side of the booth?

**BRENDAN:** This is the random voice, otherwise known as Brendan--

**TARA:** I can't see it.

**BRENDAN:** --one of the facilitators.

**LIZ:** Right, and I am Liz.

**SPARKLES:** I am God.

**RYAN:** I'm Ryan, what's up?

**SPARKLES:** God is other known as--

**JUSTIN:** God in sparkles.

**SPARKLES:** Yeah, God-- yeah.

**TARA:** [INAUDIBLE]

**JUSTIN:** He's the gay man in roller skates.

[LAUGHTER]

**TOMMY:** Yeah, Sparkles roller skated here from his house--

**SPARKLES:** How may I help you?

**JUSTIN:** OK. Oh, yeah, and if you want to come call here. The number is 713-526-5738, right? Good job.

**TOMMY:** Right. You are.

**RYAN:** It's on the wall.

**JUSTIN:** Yeah, that's what I read, 713-526-KPFT or 713-JAM-KPFT. Right?

**TOMMY:** Because we got creative with the numbers all up on the dial pad.

[LAUGHTER]

[CLICKS TONGUE]

**TARA:** That means if-- [AUDIO OUT]

**JUSTIN:** 526-5738 OK, so tonight's topic is proms. What spurred this topic is on doing three of them in a row.

**BRENDAN:** It is prom.

**JUSTIN:** Prom season. Most of us are either seniors, or graduated, or almost a senior, except for that other old guy.

**TARA:** The random voice?

**BRENDAN:** Hey!

**RYAN:** Ouch!

**BRENDAN:** I'm not that old.

**RYAN:** Ouch.

**JUSTIN:** So last week, Tara asked me to go to prom with her. We had hell a good time.

**TARA:** It was excellent.

**JUSTIN:** It was so much fun. We danced all night to the "Big Booty Ho" music all night, yeah.

**TARA:** It is great.

**JUSTIN:** We took pictures. She took pictures of her hair.

**TARA:** You are so white, though. It's so funny to watch him like dance to the "Big Booty Ho" music, as he said.

[LAUGHTER]

**BRENDAN:** Or not.

**JUSTIN:** Her project prom was at Funplex which was hella cool. It was very, very, very cool. We had fun, and I got her to go on the orbital. It scared the bejesus out of her.

**TARA:** It's because I started to fly out of it.

**JUSTIN:** But I went on it twice.

**LIZ:** We have pictures of you on it.

**JUSTIN:** Yeah, because I'm cool. Jimmy, you didn't announce my hair color this time.

**JIMMY CARPER:** Oh, I forgot. OK, the hair color of the month is--

**JUSTIN:** Blonde.

**JIMMY CARPER:** Well, there's a lot of red in there, too.

**JUSTIN:** Iced urine lemonade.

**TOMMY:** You know what? Why don't you shut the hell up?

**JUSTIN:** Why don't you get a color?

**TOMMY:** For you.

**BRENDAN:** Well, Liz has a different color as well.

**JUSTIN:** Yeah, Liz dyed her hair for prom, too.

**LIZ:** Ultraviolet green.

**JIMMY CARPER:** Yeah, of course. That is a wonderful color.

**JUSTIN:** That's not UV green.

**LIZ:** Thank you.

**JUSTIN:** It's like aqua green.

**JIMMY CARPER:** I have jewelry that color.

**LIZ:** Yeah, it's cool.

**JUSTIN:** So, Yeah prom was fun. Yes, last week.

**LIZ:** Dinner was fun, too.

**JUSTIN:** Huh?

**LIZ:** Dinner was fun with our waitress that lived with her person.

**JUSTIN:** Yeah, our waitress--

**TOMMY:** Stop.

**JUSTIN:** --had a partner at home, so I couldn't get her phone number.

**LIZ:** And the meal was excellent.

**JUSTIN:** Yeah, the meal was so good. We ate at McCormick's and Schmitt's or something, right?

**LIZ:** You had spearfish.

**JUSTIN:** Yeah, I tried spearfish for the first time. I went up to-- I was like, Miss waitress lady, I want something from far away, preferably Alaska or Hawaii.

**LIZ:** He said this. I was so mortified.

**JUSTIN:** She's like, like Kentucky?

[LAUGHTER]

**LIZ:** And then he asked--

**JUSTIN:** Here's some corn.

**TARA:** No--

**RYAN:** Three out of three, he's from Pasadena.

**LIZ:** He asked if he can keep the soda bottle.

**JUSTIN:** Yeah, it came in this cute little soda bottle thing. And I was like, right.

**BRENDAN:** What did?

**LIZ:** The soda.

**BRENDAN:** Oh, I thought you were talking about the fish.

**LIZ:** I know. I was, too.

**TOMMY:** I do, too.

**BRENDAN:** I know.

**TOMMY:** And then they did give him the soda bottle

**JUSTIN:** But Tara here wouldn't let me keep it. By the way, where is my Dr. Pepper one?

**TARA:** Anyways, and I had shark.

**JUSTIN:** It was very good.

**RYAN:** You changed the subject quick.

**LIZ:** I did.

**JUSTIN:** You used that line yesterday.

**TOMMY:** She used it like five times during prom. OK.

**JUSTIN:** I'm like, yes, but how do we fix the heat problem?

[LAUGHTER]

**LIZ:** Oh, no.

**TOMMY:** Nice. 10 points.

**JIMMY CARPER:** Good job, Justin.

**TARA:** No.

**JUSTIN:** Hey.

**TOMMY:** Yeah.

**LIZ:** That was good.

**JUSTIN:** We danced. There was people that we knew there. Just-- not Justin. David was there. He looked nice.

**LIZ:** Yes.

**LIZ:** I'm talking.

[LAUGHTER]

**JUSTIN:** Tara said I was a good prom date.

**RYAN:** I was like, whatever. It's your prom. However you want to remember it.

[LAUGHTER]

**JUSTIN:** I want to remember it with my dress over my head.

**TARA:** I believe that's like half my school.

**JUSTIN:** Was there a prom baby yet?

**LIZ:** I don't know. Every year, we've had a prom baby. Not one being had at prom, but one being conceived from prom.

**JUSTIN:** I would so like to be known as the prom baby.

**LIZ:** I told you we could have had one, but no.

[LAUGHTER]

I think I would have been more likely with like Andrea.

**JUSTIN:** Who freaked out because my legs were on like some sheet or something. Anyway, is she listening?

**LIZ:** No, she's in California today.

**JUSTIN:** OK, so she doesn't know I'm making fun of her.

**RYAN:** Just today?

**LIZ:** Yesterday and today.

**RYAN:** Oh, OK. Where in California?

**LIZ:** OK, moving on.

**RYAN:** I want to know!

**JUSTIN:** OK, so--

**LIZ:** I don't know. She's singing and doing the choir thing that she loves so much with. I don't understand, but she's doing it.

**RYAN:** It's still about Liz.

**TARA:** Yeah, it's all about--

**JUSTIN:** Well, right now, it's about Tommy's taking pictures at prom. So me and Freddie went up to go take pictures at prom. Hey, refrain from touching the microphone. You know what? I'll turn you down.

**JUSTIN:** [LAUGHS] totally. But that song that you like by Bryan Adams!

**TARA:** Who? The song?

**LIZ:** Oh, right.

**JUSTIN:** The Canadian guy, come on.

**TARA:** In the Robin Hood movie?

**JUSTIN:** I'm thinking so.

**TARA:** Andrea and I saw?

**JUSTIN:** Yes.

**TARA:** They didn't play that at our prom.

**JUSTIN:** Well, that's-- no, no.

**LIZ:** All right.

**JUSTIN:** A little anyway. They played it at our prom.

**TARA:** It's I would do anything for-- I would die for you.

**JUSTIN:** Yeah. Well, OK. So we were dancing to that, and some chick was like--

**LIZ:** Everything I do, I do for you.

**TARA:** Thank you, Liz!

**RYAN:** I would like to cut your lifeline. Kill us, Tara.

She was like, she dropped her mouth, and she was like, oh. And she like fled by, and everybody was looking at us. It was so great.

**RYAN:** Ma'am, your nose fell off.

[LAUGHTER]
