The Family and Medical Leave Act of 1993 requires companies with more than 50 employees to grant workers up to 12 weeks of unpaid leave to care for a newborn or newly adopted child or a seriously ill family member. While the measure passed easily in the house, some Senate Republicans opposed to Clinton's intention to lift the ban on gays and lesbians in the US Armed Forces attempted to attach an amendment that would have written the Pentagon's anti lesbian and gay ban into federal law. Ireland's minister for defense in the Marine has voiced support for ending discrimination based on sexual orientation in the armed forces there. He also favors decriminalization of sex acts between consenting adult males. Although he believes that the implications of decriminalization will need careful examination, he announced that a code of conduct for interpersonal relationships might be introduced in the military in the event of decriminalization. A spokesperson for the Irish gay and lesbian equality network said the group would support such a code of conduct which also dealt with heterosexual conduct in the military.

First, an effort to add sexual orientation to protected categories in the city's Human Rights Code failed in the City Assembly. Then the City Assembly approved a weaker measure prohibiting discrimination based on sexual orientation, only an employment by the city and its major contractors. Mayor Tom Fink then vetoed that bill, stating that it quote assumes that the government accepts the homosexual lifestyle as an alternate lifestyle. I believe it is not and quote, the employment protections had passed the assembly by a vote of seven to three, one vote shy of the eight needed to override the mayoral veto. Navy computer technician David carpenter intended to spend a lifetime with his partner of 10 years Lesley Ellen Hamilton. But that dream was shattered when Hamilton was diagnosed with AIDS. Hamilton's condition deteriorated until he required around the clock care, but his family refused to help and there was no one else to care for him. Service personnel are sometimes granted emergency leave in situations like this, but carpenter couldn't ask for one without either lying about the relationship or being discharged for being gay. In August 1990, carpenter jumped ship to care for Hamilton. In July 1991, carpenter used the last of his money to grant Hamilton's last wish, flying with him from California to his parents home in Georgia. Hamilton died later that month. left with nothing, carpenter returned to San Francisco. This past December he was taken into custody and incarcerated in the brig at Treasure Island. During the next month, the Navy must file formal charges against him a process which has been delayed while his service record was located. If he is court martialed, his penalties could include up to six months imprisonment and a bad conduct discharge.
