That was about five years ago, but there was a, there was a bondage group that had a whole bunch of bisexuals on it. And I started reading that, and I was like, Oh, wow, these people are human. You know, it's not like they're, you know, because I had heard all these stories and tales about how they're these, you know, evil people who would, you know, use whips and chains and things like that. And I read, I read things they read, and it was like they were, you know, like, people, people I knew would like compare them to rapists, and things like that. But I read what they wrote,
