My doctor told me the surgery was rather I mean was a necessary health measure that it didn't hurt and then and only took a moment to perform. We students filed into the newborn nursery This isn't nurse to find a baby strapped spreadeagled to plastic board on the countertop across the room. He was struggling against his restraints, tugging, whimpering and crying helplessly. No one was tending the infant but when I asked my instructor if I could comfort him, she said Why wait till the doctor gets here? I wondered how a teacher the healing arts could watch someone suffer and not offer assistance. The silence was seen broken by a piercing scream once the doctor came in the baby's reaction to having his foreskin pinched and crushed. As a doctor pinch. Touch the clamp to his penis. The shriek intensified when the doctor inserted an instrument between the foreskin and in the glands, tearing the two structures apart when you're an infant. They're attached. Yeah. Oh, separate. Oh, okay. The baby started shaking his head back and forth. The only part of his body free to move is the doctor use another clamp to crush the foreskin lengthwise, which he then cut. This made the opening of the foreskin large enough to insert a circumcision instrument. The device used to protect the glands from being severed during the surgery. The baby began to grasp and choke breathlessly from the shell continuous screams I use no anesthesia. Oh, that's nice. How could anyone say circumcision is painless when the suffering is so obvious. My bottom left begin to quiver tears fill my eyes and spilled over. I found my own subs difficult to contain. How much longer could this go on? During the next stage of this surgery, the doctor

crushed the forscan against the circumcision instrument. What they have to do is, yeah, crunch it so that when they cut it, it doesn't bleed. And so they take this device and pound it and it crushes the skin. Then finally, amputated it. The baby was slammed exhausted and spat and not been prepared. Nothing could have prepared me for this experience. To see to see a part of this baby's penis being cut off without anesthesia was devastating. Yeah, I can imagine. And that's what babies go through to this day. I mean, some hospitals are starting to use the anesthesia. Oh, how nice. But many

But, you know, it's you have to go through electrolysis and basically they do skin grafts. Oh, and get it to grow back. Wow. But the way they do it is through living scans. So what they have to do is cut a slit and the testicle sack Yes, slit the penis through after they cut that. And so this skin back and leave it there for a few weeks and then And they take once the graft is started growing again. Then they cut the skin off the testicle sack completely and attach it the rest of the way to the penis. Oh, then after it's all healed up, you have to go in and have all the hair removed.
