And the Department of Defense conducted a survey and it was not a voluntary survey. The people in the military had to under orders participate in the survey. There was 71 there was 1000s and 1000s. Who participated they visited army bases. They went on board naval ships, they went to air bases, military bases, all branches of service. And here's the results of the survey that's been conducted by the Department of Defense 80% of the 71,000 respondents stated that they have heard offensive speech, derogatory names or jokes about homosexuals in the last 12 months of which 85% agreed that it was tolerated. 37% have witnessed or experienced any event or behavior that they considered harassment based on perceived homosexuality. 57% of those surveys surveyed indicated that they had not had training on the harassment policy. And 46% of those who knew about the policy said that it was either slightly or not effective at preventing harassment based on perceived homosexuality. Those are the hard numbers. Why did this survey take place? It took place after a Army sergeant was beaten to death with baseball bats not around we talked about a son enlisted man in the army was beaten to death by baseball bats out there in Kentucky because he was perceived to have been gay. That is how our Don't Ask Don't Tell.
