And certificates is a whole plant extract of marijuana. And they sell it as an under the tongue spray. It takes about 10 minutes to work. But many multiple sclerosis patients are finding great relief from that product. And it will be available in Canada in about two to three months. And then fourth story I did want to touch on deals with the fact that the federal government has done a study, they're now showing that teenagers are smoking fewer cigarettes or using less illegal drugs. But they were pointing out also that there's a troubling increase in the use of inhalants by younger adolescents. And they tout this as a success. And of course, these inhalants paint and gasoline and all the various products they kids put in a bag or somehow have Yeah, the huffing and glues, yes, and it's so dangerous. It's it is the worst drug of, you know, immediate impact.

And what they're going to do is use these chemical whines like they use at the airports to sniff out explosives or whatever, they're going to use it to search for drug use in school by finding molecules on people's clothing or their within their locker or in their ID badge and somehow trace it down to a specific drug and put these kids into trouble because there are molecules, you know, on their clothes, that alert to these drugs.
