Properly speaking, the state has neither the right nor the power to grant marriages in the religious sense. As a Christian, I believe that marriage is performed by the church and by God not granted by the State, and I assume other religions have similar perspectives. The state merely recognizes the union of a husband and wife and in no way creates or legitimizes their marriage. The government only recognizes marriages for the convenience and handling property, taxation, inheritance, etc. And other situation when recognition is expedient visitation rights in hospitals etc. The second meaning of marriage is a secular operation of the state, and neither regulates nor reflects upon the religious bond of marriage. The church and his teaching should govern marriage in its religious sense, but marriage as recognized by the state as a legal practice, and cannot be defined by religious institutions. The US government in the state of Texas provide religious liberty by remaining secular we are free to worship if and how we want to because the government does not exert political power over religious issues. To protect religious freedom, governmental recognition of marriage must remain entirely in the secular sphere of social life. Any state claimed to regulate the religious act of marriage goes beyond political action, and threatens the freedom of religion guaranteed by a disinterested secular government. In this light, every state right commission of marriage amounts to a secular civil union. This does not denigrate the sanctity of marriage. Rather, it affirms the religious importance of marriage by denying the state the right to own it. A Church's decision on whether it will bless same sex unions can and should be carried out in the context of the church's traditions and teachings. The secular state, however, must remain blind to religious distinctions among its citizens. If ensuring religious freedom means the state must be secular, then it must be indifferent to the citizens religious beliefs and cannot base legal policy on religious teachings. Every citizen of the state must be guaranteed the same rights granted to its other citizens if the state finds it reasonable to grant legal rights and privileges to heterosexual citizens living in committed relationships. It cannot justly deny the same rights to homosexual citizens. In Texas, a man and a woman achieve common law marriage simply by living together and holding property in common. No ceremony or intent is required. legislation banning homosexual civil unions is a deeply moral issue. But the question is not about sexual ethics is a question about discrimination. From women's enfranchisement to the civil rights movement to the unit, the United States in the past century, has constantly come down against

discrimination and for equal treatment under the law. The real moral issue at stake is the banning civil unions is the state's unconscionable discrimination against a minority of its citizens. As an American, and especially as a Christian, I cannot support such discrimination. That position remains valid, no matter what your convictions about your morality of homosexuality. I hope that you will seriously consider this perspective while evaluating proposed, quote, marriage unquote, legislation. And please remind your representatives that the greatness of our democracy is demonstrated when the majority makes every effort to defend the threatened rights of a minority.
