

- And [INAUDIBLE]. For the end of the week, we'll have the devices down. But how you [INAUDIBLE] computer back to [INAUDIBLE]. How are you going to make that [INAUDIBLE]?

Well, I want you to know that, if the rest of the Republic have lost their sense of smell, I have not. The maximum thing that can happen here, just a Class A misdemeanor. We're talking about seizing and taking \$50,000 from the man's property without a warrant. We're talking about tearing up another \$8,000 or \$10,000 worth of computer and other business equipment. [INAUDIBLE] misdemeanor [INAUDIBLE]. [INAUDIBLE] everything.

I mean, [INAUDIBLE] what we're talking about here. Which, we're talking about-- I mean, and ain't nobody-- have you ever seen anybody run up to anybody and say, you are going to buy this rubber duck or I'm going to beat you up? No.

But let me tell you, in the city of Houston, on any given day, there are thousands of dollars worth [INAUDIBLE].

- This is [INAUDIBLE] show out there [INAUDIBLE].

- And nobody has made--

- This has raised my consciousness here.

- Absolutely. But no [INAUDIBLE]. But the fact of the matter is, if we can't handle the traffic [INAUDIBLE], what the hell are we doing with [INAUDIBLE]? If we can't handle the Class A-- we [INAUDIBLE] let it rot [INAUDIBLE] Class A and B misdemeanor. [INAUDIBLE] messing with people's lives [INAUDIBLE].

You've got [INAUDIBLE]. [INAUDIBLE] Class A Misdemeanors. [INAUDIBLE] what you heard [INAUDIBLE]. The class is the first Class B misdemeanor. [INAUDIBLE]

And that's only because I run [INAUDIBLE] uncomfortable. [INAUDIBLE] And then the [INAUDIBLE] over the long haul [INAUDIBLE]

I cannot bear to keep [INAUDIBLE] most of those charges. [INAUDIBLE]. But I want you folks out there [INAUDIBLE]-- especially you guys down on the line. [INAUDIBLE]. You know how much of your cave is your stuff. [INAUDIBLE]

Well, do you [INAUDIBLE] used to [INAUDIBLE]. Is it possible we could have been [INAUDIBLE] from cancer [INAUDIBLE] for assaulting the officer by hitting the officer first in the head. [INAUDIBLE] I didn't never [INAUDIBLE].

[INAUDIBLE] drunk and stupid anyway. [INAUDIBLE]

The rest of you know how much a good case [INAUDIBLE]. And I [INAUDIBLE] how wrong you are. You all know what amount of [INAUDIBLE]. [INAUDIBLE] he's poor and he's Black and he's ignorant. [INAUDIBLE] stupid and you're dumb.

Mostly because of the [INAUDIBLE]. That's where you got a certain percentage that you time can be chalked up to [INAUDIBLE] rest of the [INAUDIBLE].

But if everybody just got the time they earn from the case, it would be a lot less high in demand. And time to process for [INAUDIBLE] who steals 1,000 cars [INAUDIBLE] bank in will be about the same as the guy who stole 5 or 10 cars [INAUDIBLE]. And if the difference between those two [INAUDIBLE] one of them is much greater in financial value than the other, the one with the greatest value got the less time. Because there's damage in the system.

And you can say, well, they all-- everybody's down there [INAUDIBLE] to allow [INAUDIBLE]. Number one, I'm not too sure. There's some [INAUDIBLE]. But the point I want to make is that there is no hint of equality under the law and [INAUDIBLE] reporter [INAUDIBLE].

And there is no sense of justice, because that's part of the oath that the [INAUDIBLE]. And there is no [INAUDIBLE] my client with everything I've got [INAUDIBLE] paying him [INAUDIBLE]. [INAUDIBLE] with this part of [INAUDIBLE].

There's so much wrong with this system. But the most important thing that's wrong with the system [INAUDIBLE]. It's that the people involved in the criminal justice system are [INAUDIBLE] not [INAUDIBLE]

I feel [INAUDIBLE]. There were the most [INAUDIBLE]. The difference is [INAUDIBLE] were living in a period [INAUDIBLE].

Have positive attributes. [INAUDIBLE] they negative attributes and think about and the best way to illustrate that was to have you listen to their [INAUDIBLE] and [INAUDIBLE] and children. And suddenly, the [INAUDIBLE] of this war was a lot like the people [INAUDIBLE] nasty, ugly, evil [INAUDIBLE].

And so [INAUDIBLE] people? Well, if-- if we are going to become providers of the worst things that [INAUDIBLE] other people are doing, maybe, maybe we need to take some time to think about it. Because are we not as a whole society becoming more violent, more [INAUDIBLE], more [INAUDIBLE]? And is that not going to ultimately [INAUDIBLE]

At what point do we, as a civilized society, separate ourselves [INAUDIBLE]

Half of the people in death row from Texas are from [INAUDIBLE]. Half of the people in death row in the United States are from Texas. So there, obviously, [INAUDIBLE]

There are other people who [INAUDIBLE] the most executed place on Earth. If that is such a good idea, then why is this not the safest place on Earth? I mean, if it was working, shouldn't we have some evidence that it's working? But there's not a whole lot of evidence that it is working.

Capital punishment and execution do not work any better than [INAUDIBLE] as a whole. There's an awful lot of people locked up for [INAUDIBLE] because that was not [INAUDIBLE] safety. [INAUDIBLE] radio because you're absolutely certain that it requires [INAUDIBLE]

--apartment complex at the entrance of [INAUDIBLE]. [INAUDIBLE] should be a wonderful Saturday brunch. In today's [INAUDIBLE], guess what? The election is missing. [INAUDIBLE]. If something does not work, doing more of it is not going to make it work any better. I mean, you don't have to be a rocket scientist to figure all of this out.

The reality is that with the exception of this little radio program and the handful of good writers in the written [INAUDIBLE], you're not going to get the other side of [INAUDIBLE] because all of society drinking is being turned clearly against us. The most important thing to do is [INAUDIBLE]. And the other thing [INAUDIBLE]. 15 years [INAUDIBLE]. And then they started taking politics [INAUDIBLE].
