I think it's a problem, the media sends mixed messages about, you know, the new cure for AIDS and protease inhibitors, etc. And it's also just there's a generation gap between older gay men and younger gay men. And being a young gay man, I'm 21 years old, you know, I see that generation gap. And I see what how people use that to make excuses for unsafe behavior that, you know, I'm 21. AIDS is something that affects people who are older than me, you know, they're all dead. I don't ever see them out the bars. This is me, I'm living now, you know, I'm living for right now. And I can't get harmed by that.

And you can be around a lot longer, to have a lot more fun, which is what we're trying to convey that this disease, really, it's not done yet, there's going to be a whole second wave. And people need to kind of realize that especially people who are in my group. So that's kind of the aim and the focus that we're taking without being too boring. You know, talking about
