So I have held and and in my case, I was very lucky, last year's auction rate of raised about \$3,000. Oh, congratulations. Yeah, that's pretty good. And then I'm also looking at a lot of the most of the times, whenever someone asks you to come someplace, they will help you out with part of your airplane fare or, and or finding you a place to stay. So that helps a lot. And then also we do a lot, I do a lot of fundraisers here in the bar, which helps a lot in people. And whenever I do go someplace, I always ask if I can get parts in which that raises money. And that helps out a lot. So, but a lot of it still is a very expensive proposition. If you have a national or major weather title holder,
