I think you have to be an exhibitionist, which she is you have to be an extrovert, which she is and you have to be course very sex positive, which she is. So she talks about that. And there's some very, there's a very touching essay, actually, where she wrote a letter to her mother about it. Remember, oh, she never told her mother and her mother died and she was saying, Well, how would I confront my mother about this? And then she kind of goes into all the stuff about being sex positive and a sex negative society and how people are you know, repressed by set society repressed in their sexuality and and a lot of it really You know, struck home for me. I mean, that was me. That was me. You know, my parents weren't even terribly repressive, but it's just the society as a whole. I mean, don't touch yourself down there. Don't do that, you know,

So you know, those of you who are listening who would like to write this information down, please prepare to do so. The oiling Spiegel society is a not for profit corporation. Most of these groups are, which began as an informal association in the winter of 1977. I'm sorry, 1971. We support sexual liberation as a basic requirement for a truly free society. Our special concern is freedom for sexual minorities, and particularly the rights of those whose sexuality embraces DS or dominant submissive fantasies and urges. These rights have largely largely been denied through negative public attitudes internalized to a great extent by those possession possessing such inclination themselves. To realize these rights we seek to foster consciousness raising and understanding among our members and the public at large through public forums and workshops on DSX advertising dissemination of society publications and literature by providing speakers for all forms of media colleges and other audiences and by giving support to other sexual liberation movements. Most of all, we extend to our brothers and sisters who may be as we once were isolated, repressed and frustrated. The word that they are not alone that a society exists for them straight, gay and bisexual all working together with understanding and warmth against myths, misunderstandings and stereotypes for freedom and fulfillment.
