And this is one of the major tragedies of such erroneous beliefs. But I do want to point out that the closing of the foundation is unrelated to federal aid funding that also bears Ryan White's name. Now the good news is that Jeanne white Ginder is not giving up, she's now going to start the Ryan White project, which is a new effort to bolster AIDS education among young people, and to lobby for continual federal funding for AIDS programs.
