We condemn any policy that would not allow gay lesbian, bisexual or transgendered individuals to fully participate at all levels in any activity without within scouting. PFLAG asserts that one sexual orientation and gender identity are separate from one's moral values and actions, the negative stereotypes and attitudes engendered by the Boy Scouts of America as exclusionary practice and such practices are detrimental to all youth and society as a whole, causing further alienation and lowered self esteem among gay lesbian, bisexual, and transgendered youth. The injury caused by this discrimination, and those attitudes violate the tradition of the boys God's values of honesty, friendliness, kindness, and fair play. PFLAG calls upon the Boy Scouts of America, to end its discrimination and to live up to the words of its federal charter. Quote, neither the charter nor the bylaws of the Boy Scouts of America permits the exclusion of any boy. To meet these responsibilities. We have made a commitment that our membership shall be representative of all the population in every community, district and council and quote, We further challenged the Boy Scouts of America and all its members associations at all levels of the organization to adopt non discrimination policies, which include gay, lesbian, bisexual and transgendered youth volunteers and leaders. We condemn the use of public funds by private groups that discriminate and call upon public facilities to cease their support of the Boy Scouts of America until such non discrimination policies are adopted. And this was the resolution adopted by the PFLAG board of directors on July 17. Now, folks update on that many city governments from Chicago to San Francisco to New York to Florida, have told the boy scouts that they may no longer use public schools, libraries and other public facilities including publicly supported campgrounds for Boy Scouts.

Interesting a flip side to this, the Girl Scouts of America, were just recently on CNN, where they're talking about that they are in a big crunch. They are in desperate need of leaders. And where traditionally, Girl Scouts and the Girl Scout leaders are either mothers, or grandmothers of current scouts. They are looking at now trying to get more business women, more single moms into being scout leaders. And one part that they did emphasize in there is that they are not a part of the controversy. They are different from the Boy Scouts of America. And they are very open about their non discrimination policy. Right, they do not have the same value as the Boy Scouts of America. And I think it was very

interesting. And it's something that they they bring up quite often that they that they're separating themselves. And I'm surprised that we haven't seen a reverse backlash where we're seeing or I've seen any fundamentalist groups going after the Girl Scouts saying you need to stop saying this because it sounds like you're promoting lesbianism. And it's surprising they haven't jumped on that yet.
