And this means that Anyone who has ever seen a doctor, be they allergy sufferers, cancer patients or people with AIDS would be at risk, should their physician pharmacy or hospital decide to take advantage of the legislations commercial loophole, the Republican sponsored bill is being called the Patient Protection Act of 1998. And then this would overrule more restrictive state laws and allow anyone who collects health insurance information, including hospitals, health maintenance organizations, doctors, pharmacies and insurers, to provide that data to anyone in the health care provider or health plan for health care operations, according to the post, and I call that protection. Yes, very ironic. That has been called the Patient Protection Act of 1998.

Director of the policy institute for the National Gay Lesbian Task Force said that those ads ad campaigns are not isolated events. They are part of a coordinated strategy to lobby political leaders and stop progress toward equal rights. Now the first of those ads, truth and love campaign appeared in The New York Times on July 13. And they were followed by ads in the Washington Post on July 14, and USA Today on the 15th.
