Morning. This is the After Hours report. I'm Jeff Mackey. As was discussed earlier, the Houston Lesbian Gay Pride Week 1990 Planning Committee adopted official rules to govern the operation of the organization in coming years and its general meeting Wednesday, April 25. Rules were written by John Nicks male co chair who is charged in November as the secretary of the committee to research the usual policies and practice of the group and to draft rules that reflected those policies. So details of the wording of several sections in the rules were changed by amendment after the rules were read. Only two motions were major changes were debated. The changes both proposed by Lee Harrington would have required Pride Week officers to be open enough to appear before the media and would have made inclusion of the words Lesbian Gay Pride Week or gay lesbian depending on the year to appear on all official stationery marketable products including T shirts, buttons and other items and publicity regarding the celebration. Harrington later amended his own proposal regarding officers willingness to be public to include heads of official Pride Week subcommittees as well, as opposed to the motion cited to concerns of people who wish to be involved in the planning process, but are not out to the point where they can appear publicly. To allow their participation will be depriving the planning body of valuable talent, energy and organizational skills, said Clark Moore secretary of the executive committee. Both motions were defeated and the rules were adopted by the body. During the meeting, the planning committee co chair gave an update of planned events and the Pride week schedule have been so far scheduled our Friday June 15 AstroWorld night

Ray Hill said he is waiting for confirmation proposed mail honorary Grand Marshal Craig Washington. The fundraising committee announced two coming fundraisers, one of which is scheduled for this Sunday April 29. This afternoon, two to 6pm at heaven pride in performance, a variety show co hosted by lady victoria lust of the Lesbian Gay Pride Week executive committee. BJ summers candidate for Ms. T. Gra and Mark Coleman candidate for Mr. T Gra, and it features a long line of recognized community performers and specialty acts. The other fundraiser the Watson auction will be held May 20 at the Brazos River bottom. A preview of items to be auctioned will begin at 2pm with the auction scheduled to begin at 4pm. Committee members are currently seeking donations of items for the event Montrose city council member Vince Ryan gala has been community leaders and a spokesperson for AIDS Foundation Houston are claiming that bureaucratic muddle and foot dragging by the city are to blame for keeping stone soup food pantry and it's almost closet sized original location. Ryan and John Paul barnidge former AFH Board Chair say efforts to obtain the city on vacant building first intended as the site for the Montrose branch library had been strangled in city red tape for two years. The building, along with two adjacent buildings that were condemned and slated for demolition has been sitting vacant at Mendell enrichment for almost five years. Ryan, who says he has been working on this project since February of 1988. demanded documentation of a policy claimed by city officials to prevent a long term lease of the property during the council members pop off session at the council meeting Wednesday, April 25. Ryan said city attorney Clarence West has yet to produce evidence of a city ordinance state law or even a written policy preventing the lease or any said needs foundation Houston had proposed to the city at least two years ago an agreement whereby the foundation would renovate the property and maintain the grounds in return for a five year rent free lease for the pantry. The city agreed to provide the site rent free, but only on a month to month basis and arrangement that would be impractical for the foundation, since a deteriorating building requires major renovations. Additionally, barnidge said a separate storeroom would have to be constructed for the property to serve the needs of Stone Soup. The Barnett said he believes community organizations and individuals would donate services, supplies and funds to do the project right. No one in the right mind would make such donations to renovate property that might be sold in mileage on a 30 day notice. What makes a Richmond property a former convenience store particularly frustrating concern for Ryan's office is the fact that the location has been targeted as a city owned eyesore by neighborhood groups as well. The buildings were purchased with Houston public library department funds in 1981. For locating the Montrose library there, the library product project has moved to another location in the city, which paid about \$947,000 for the property when land values were the high was left holding the bag on the side that could not be resold at market without a substantial loss. In February, library spokesperson David Bates said the property had been reverted to the dangerous buildings department and would probably be demolished. And the council member and AFH negotiated with various city departments in 1988 and 89. And were told in May of 89 that the library department intended to clean up the property for sale so the funds could be used for other library projects. But in February of this year, Bates told the Montrose voice at the library or department no longer had anything to do with the site and that his fate was up in the air. Meanwhile, clients of the president stone soup a six foot by 24 foot pantry space on California street often must wait in line outside the building for their turn to shop for the groceries. Or instead he would like to see a new location wherever it turns out to be with ample room for waiting clients to sit inside the building and Apple storage facilities. The Texas Human

Rights Foundation thr F has announced the receipt of two grants totaling over \$1,600. From the Design industry's Foundation for AIDS and razzle dazzle Dallas. The monies will go toward support of the thr F two main current areas of work. Its aids legal resource project and prosecution of its challenge to the constitutionality of the Texas sodomy statute and the 2106 case of the grants awarded. One is for \$1,000 from Diffa, the main producer of the national tour of heartstrings and evening of hopefully hearing aids heartstrings played in Houston in February of this year and in San Antonio last October. The money will be used by th RF to help pay overhead costs and operation of the AIDS legal resource project during the 12 month period ending March 21. The project started total of two 528 clients. The project is a statewide counseling and referral service for persons who have AIDS related legal problems. Thr F has also received a grant for part of approximately \$600 from razzle dazzle Dallas receiving notification recently from that organization's President 300 door for wrestling, razzle dazzle Dallas is the annual Lesbian and Gay Pride Week celebration station Dallas. The \$600 grant represent the additional proceeds held back by razzle dazzle Dallas after its 1989 event, as an emergency fund to be distributed to the organizations in the gay and lesbian community if not tapped sooner for an appropriate need. Texas Human Rights Foundation had previously received \$6,000 from razzle dazzle Dallas as a beneficiary of the proceeds of the 1989 has been. Thr F board member David Bryan said that the monies from razzle dazzle dollars would be used to help pay legal fees and educational costs. In thr s lawsuit challenging the constitutionality of the Texas sodomy statute section 2106 of the Texas penal code. The case known as Morales at all versus the state of Texas, seeks to invalidate the Texas law which criminalizes the private consensual sexual relations of two persons of the same sex. Todd added we are screening this movie because it lends so much to human understanding to the fight against AIDS. Every bit of the proceeds from this movie will go to benefit AIDS Foundation Houston. I guess if the house and we are so very lucky, each one of us, you know, things are bad, but things could be worse. You know, there are 1000s and 1000s of gay and lesbian people all across this country that are homeless 1000s of gamblers mean people who don't have after hours, not just 1000s but literally millions of people. And I think about the the young gay and lesbian people in Fort Smith, Arkansas when I went home from my father's funeral all they had was that one little bar. Yeah, I remember you calling in no radio to listen to No, this week in Texas of the Montrose boys or Pride Week committee, nobody to go and fight with like we scrapped. Yeah, and dig here in Texas, it was in Houston. And there's places in Texas where it's just as bad. You know, it's really a little towns, it's really something else. And this is, I don't know, this is a really strange time in my life, because I'm really beginning to understand just how wonderful life is and how quickly it goes by but how every day is something very, very special. And we've told you time and time again that you're in charge of your life and the only way to make it better is to come out and do for yourself. We can give you the tools and the directions and the numbers to call but you're going to have to make that decision yourself to step forward We've all had to make it and we all did it at different times in our lives, you know. And when we rag, the folks that the Pride Week committee, those are good people. They're just caught in that trap that trap of helplessness and hopelessness, that trap that homophobia has got over them, and they have to get out of that mess. And they can only get out of it. If we continue to fight. We'll continue to speak out. And that's what we do every week right here. So we encourage you to come forward and make something out of your life, baby, it goes by so very, very fast. But Gerald for you, this is Mahalia Jackson singing from the album, I believe, and this particular song is called, I'm grateful and Oh, baby. Are we grateful this morning, right? Yeah. That's not that's a queen. What happened here is that she pushed the wrong button. Looking at her rear side. Should we listen to that? screwed up? Let's go ahead and hit my hell yeah. Do you want to hear this? Yeah, I was gonna talk about queers in the closet and play Elton John, what a good lead in for that. Anyway, we are grateful. See, it's even that we screwed up, right. I remember the show that we did when you were in Arkansas, and we had quite a few of those. Really? Yeah. You know, I read a story about a gentleman that called Hank Aaron, you remember Hank Aaron? Yes. When he got like 723 I may be wrong because I don't have the book in front of me. But somewhere around in there. He was getting ready to tie Babe Ruth homerun record. And he said he called the baseball club that that Hank Aaron belong to and ask how many strikeouts had he had in his life, and he had over double the amount of homeruns that he had hit. So even Hank Aaron had to strike out twice as hard twice as many times as he hit homeruns to be a number one see, baby. So those little screw ups are all part of life. But I'll tell you another little story. And then I'll play Mahalia Jackson, I promise gonna have my finger on the right button. I have a friend who his kid. And he's told me this story before his kid had a contest in school, they took an egg duck egg, and put it in an incubator and hatched it. And the kids in school watch this duck hatch from the egg. And he they had a drawing after the duck was born. And his son one or sort of he lost but anyway, the kid brought the duck home and oh, so Daddy in the sun went out in the backyard. This is a true story. And they built a little pen to put the duck in. Yeah. Well, in years past, the boy grew up and went away from home and the duck and the daddy stayed there. The problem with this story is that daddy built the duck pen right next to his bedroom window as the duck got older. Guess what? It would just quack and carry on and

raise hell. And it just he said for see couldn't figure out what was wrong with this duck because it he didn't know if it didn't like the food or if it didn't like the water or if it didn't like the house or whatever the hell it was.
