We have met on a regular basis since then, since returning from Amsterdam, we've adopted a new set of guidelines and bylaws. We're committed to staying with the funds that we have. And we are recommitting ourselves to serving the HIV affected community and not being political. First, we're going to have to be political, because this is a political disease. But unlike judge Lindsey, we are going to address people's needs first. And interestingly enough, and I can't give you any names to verify this, Miss Sue Cooper's derivative, should we say is already in hot water with the county department, her supervisor has found her a most disagreeable person. So surprise judge Lindsay. But we're still there, the greater Houston AIDS Alliance is alive. We've elected Mo Jones, a person living with AIDS as our chairperson, our Vice Chair is Dr. Laurie Hinton, a woman who is very much dedicated to this disease and the eradication, or at least the response to it. And so we're still in business. And we hope to continue to serve you as well as

we can. And we hope that time is short. But the disease doesn't look like it's going to be that it looks like there's going to be a need for us to be around for quite a while. So. Wait, we ask for your support in our continued stance.

The Department of Defense Defense Intelligence Agency has a 20 year perfect Sterling work record as a soldier, and the day that we received the phone call February the 12th 1986 is indelibly imprinted in my mind that he was HTLV three positive. What's known now as HIV positive. They put him in Walter Reed Army Medical Hospital, and essentially booted him out of the army and treated him as if he were vermin and a pariah for the rest of his life. They told him quote, unquote, go home and die. This is after his commanding officer went to the Joint Chiefs of Staff in the Pentagon, because Josh did work in the Pentagon, and begged for Josh to be able to retain his job because he was very healthy and very proficient. And they said, No, they didn't want him. They didn't want this disease. scoured soldier. gay and lesbians are in the military and a number higher than they are probably in the general public. Because it is a safe haven. It's somewhere that you can go and not be expected to be married. You can have a well regimented life. There are a lot of gay people in the military, having been a gay wife, if you

will, for some years. I know they're there. Bush knows that they're Colin Powell knows they're there. But they treat their gay and lesbian soldiers abysmally. And we need to bring an end to that. Clinton has promised to do away with the ban on homosexuals in the military. And so this will be one more opportunity to send that message to the military, and remind Mr. Clinton that even though the Democratic Convention is over with now, we still considered an important issue for those people who do decide to exercise the option to serve their country. openly and proudly, aren't the
