MCHALE:

MCHALE:

MCHALE:

SCOTT LEWIS: The headline is gay presence has stabilized neighborhoods. And it just talks about how all over the country in-- they did a study of like 15 urban areas-- how when gays move into neighborhoods, it stabilizes the neighborhood. People are moving to the suburbs and stuff.

HOWARD Yeah.

MCHALE:

SCOTT LEWIS: Gays come in, take over, fix up the homes, redevelop, make it more desirable place to live. And then actually the people that are moving back out to the suburbs end up coming back in to these areas because the gays have made them desirable to live in, so very interesting.

HOWARD Was that study put out by the United States Realtors Association?

MCHALE:

SCOTT LEWIS: It was a--

HOWARD Yeah, something like that. So that's encouraging. We've always known that.

MCHALE:

SCOTT LEWIS: Right. We need to point out-- I hear the phone ringing out there-- that we are in the middle of marathon. And we are still what about \$80, \$85 from our goal.

HOWARD \$80 from our goal tonight, yeah.

MCHALE:

SCOTT LEWIS: So one \$90 pledge could put us over the top.

HOWARD Or three \$35 pledges.

MCHALE:

SCOTT LEWIS: That's right. Big or small, it all--

HOWARD We love it all.

MCHALE:

Seattle has a new city ordinance that allows gay and straight living adult couples to register as domestic partners. Under the ordinance, couples pay \$25 and receive a certificate from the city clerk's office. The document does provide no legal benefits. About 90 couples, mostly gay, registered Tuesday.

HOWARD Wow, let's move to Seattle.

MCHALE:

SCOTT LEWIS: Domestic partnerships in Seattle.

HOWARD I would love a domestic partner or maybe a sleepover domestic partner.

MCHALE:

SCOTT LEWIS: Please, you just love any partner besides your hand. Speaking of--

HOWARD Speaking of my hand. No.

MCHALE:

SCOTT LEWIS: Miss Camp America is coming up.

HOWARD This Saturday night.

MCHALE:

SCOTT LEWIS: This Saturday?

HOWARD Yeah, next Saturday. Miss America pageant always falls on Miss Camp America pageant, which is next Saturday

MCHALE: at Jones Hall, correct?

SCOTT LEWIS: You are absolutely right. I didn't even realize this. And I'm going to be there. I'm going to this.

HOWARD How come you didn't ask me?

MCHALE:

SCOTT LEWIS: Because my ticket was given to me. I didn't have an extra one.

HOWARD Yeah, yeah, yeah.

MCHALE:

SCOTT LEWIS: You know how that goes.

HOWARD I know how that goes. You never think of me anymore.

MCHALE:

SCOTT LEWIS: Yeah, well, only the time I saw you naked, I can't get that image from burned from the back of my mind. It won't go away. I wake up sometimes in the morning. [SCREAM] Oh, it's just a flashback.

MCHALE:

MCHALE:

SCOTT LEWIS: And we throw this on behind us just for Christine.

HOWARD Just for Christine. We love you. We love everyone tonight. We wish we had meant love, but--

MCHALE:

SCOTT LEWIS: Oh, what the heck?

HOWARD What do we need them for?

MCHALE:

SCOTT LEWIS: Girl, what do you mean?

HOWARD Christine gave \$100.

MCHALE:

SCOTT LEWIS: Christine gave a \$100 pledge. Thank you so much. And she said she loves the show.

HOWARD Yay, Christine.

MCHALE:

SCOTT LEWIS: She loves the show. Thank you, Christine. We love you.

HOWARD She's a beast.

MCHALE:

SCOTT LEWIS: A little "Go West" in the background. This is for Christine in the background, *Go West* once again.

HOWARD Oh, good.

MCHALE:

SCOTT LEWIS: So what else is going on? Well, you don't have your headphones on, girl.

HOWARD Oh, well, where's my headphones at?

MCHALE:

SCOTT LEWIS: The only way you're going to-- the only way you're going to hear it without your headphones--

HOWARD It crunched my hair.

MCHALE:

SCOTT LEWIS: --is if you're Dionne Warwick, and you think you're psychic.

HOWARD You are too cruel to me.

MCHALE:

SCOTT LEWIS: What is up with this-- have you seen the psychic that-- what's her name? Is it Julie Brown that was on-- is it Julie Brown that was on MTV?

JIMMY CARPER: Downtown Julie Brown.

SCOTT LEWIS: Downtown Julie Brown. Well, she's pushing some psychic now who's wearing like a powder wig. Have you seen this guy?

HOWARD No, I haven't.

MCHALE:

SCOTT LEWIS: She's on TV with him, and he's wearing like a powder wig. It's the weirdest thing I've ever seen.

JIMMY CARPER: Just playing behind this for Christine.

HOWARD Well, if he is a psychic, then he obviously knows that there's a good hairdresser in the world.

MCHALE:

SCOTT LEWIS: Well, I would think you would know that too, but--

HOWARD Oh, these headphones squish my hair.

MCHALE:

MATT: You had a real sweet sounding lady call in. She wanted to give her number to Kathy or Cindy. But they need to call back because I don't have their number.

HOWARD Kathy and Cindy have to call back.

MCHALE:

SCOTT LEWIS: I have Cindy's number somewhere. I don't know what I did with it.

HOWARD What a crazy night.

MCHALE:

SCOTT LEWIS: I tell you. These guys and gals are just-- it says a lot. I think we all want a love connection. Don't you deep down inside, Big Daddy?

HOWARD Yeah, I wake up every morning and go home.

MCHALE:

[LAUGHTER]

I wake up every--

SCOTT LEWIS: And then when I get home, what do you do when you get home?

HOWARD I wake up every morning. It gets kind of lonely, but yeah, timing was whatever happens [INAUDIBLE].

MCHALE:

SCOTT LEWIS: You can't push it. I found that I so desperately-- here when I originally started the Husband Hunt, I so desperately wanted a relationship that I ended up getting involved with a guy who I met here over the air on the Husband Hunt. And it just really didn't work. And we both pushed for it because we just wanted it so bad, and it just wasn't meant to be.

HOWARD Yeah.

MCHALE:

MCHALE:

[LAUGHTER]

Oh, jeez, you're crazy. I'm going to say it again. It was a wild show. Sharon Stone has got to be the bestest.

SCOTT LEWIS: Sharon is one of my favorite guests.

HOWARD She's really my favorite girl. She's wild. She's crazy. And her girlfriend is so cute.

MCHALE:

SCOTT LEWIS: Her girlfriend is beautiful.

HOWARD I know.

MCHALE:

SCOTT LEWIS: Beautiful woman, beautiful woman.

HOWARD I tell you. Oh, Sharon must have something that we don't know about. She must have something. What do you
MCHALE: think she has? A Jeff Stryker at home.

[LAUGHTER]

SCOTT LEWIS: Oh, who doesn't have one of those at home? I know you do.

HOWARD I do not.

MCHALE:

SCOTT LEWIS: Oh, I'm not even--

HOWARD I hung out of my true value store.

MCHALE:

SCOTT LEWIS: The hammer.

HOWARD The hammer.

MCHALE:

SCOTT LEWIS: And we are not talking about MC Hammer.

HOWARD It's a whole new meaning of home improvement.

MCHALE:

SCOTT LEWIS: Oh, I tell you what.

HOWARD What? We still need-- oh, we went over our goals in our gain, but hey, at the last minute, at 10 minutes to 3:00,

MCHALE: why don't you call in and pledge \$20, \$15, or \$10, or real small one right here at KPFT?

SCOTT LEWIS: In honor of Howard's penis, a real small one. Inside and Out Productions is proud to present *Bent* by Martin Sherman directed by Bob Maddox. It's a shattering, hypnotic, and gripping play about one of the most-- it's probably one of the most significant plays produced in post World War II theater.

Bent focuses on the fate of Germany's gays in the Nazi concentration camps. One of the unspoken atrocities of Hitler's reign is brought vividly to life in this powerful, sensual, and heartbreaking story. Well, they have a good PR person who wrote this.

JIMMY CARPER: No, he was killed by a hustler a few years ago.

MCHALE:

MATT: Well, do you know what hustler got discovered in Hollywood by Sal Mineo? It was Don Johnson, who did a live rape scene in a play with Sal Mineo on stage.

MCHALE:

MATT: Well, anyway--

SCOTT LEWIS: This very play.

MATT: --Terry and Cindy-- you'll have to call back.

SCOTT LEWIS: Terry and Cindy have to call back. 526-5738 526-KPFT-- that's the pledge line. And then we're in here. We're in at 526-4000. The show that got Don Johnson started. And we need to point out that it does contain nudity and adult subject matter.

HOWARD I'm going.

MCHALE:

SCOTT LEWIS: And it's recommended for mature audiences. The address here at the station is 419 Lovett, in care of *After Hours* for our complimentary tickets. Make those attention, Scott Lewis.

HOWARD Hey, hey, hey.

MCHALE:

SCOTT LEWIS: Oh, this is over at the Skyline Theater, which is on the ninth floor of the Houston House Apartments.

JIMMY CARPER: Isn't that a fun place?

SCOTT LEWIS: It is a neat place. I almost moved into the Houston House Apartments. It's a real neat, high-rise building over there. I came real close. We almost did move in to that apartment.

HOWARD But now you live across the street from me, and you like it.

MCHALE:

SCOTT LEWIS: But it was either living there or across the street from Big Daddy.

HOWARD Mm, you just said that because I'm here.

MCHALE:

SCOTT LEWIS: I just say that because you're queer.

HOWARD Who told you I was queer?

MCHALE:

SCOTT LEWIS: Your hair.

HOWARD Well, it's almost closed. And you know what happened? We didn't get a husband tonight again, Scott.

MCHALE:

SCOTT LEWIS: Again.

HOWARD Again.

MCHALE:

SCOTT LEWIS: It figures.

HOWARD What happened?

MCHALE:

SCOTT LEWIS: But Anthony was kind of cute. I'd have taken him myself, but he has so many other offers.

HOWARD I know that Anthony-- he did something. He's a little too young for me. Where are those chunky, 35-year-old

MCHALE: Hispanic men who are sitting home now, scratching their bellies, and watching Super Bowl reruns, and praying that the baseball strike is over?

SCOTT LEWIS: Can we have some backup music?

JIMMY CARPER: Yeah.

HOWARD Yeah, there was a backup music. And yeah, well, another Saturday night alone, scragging the streets of beautiful

MCHALE: downtown Montrose.

SCOTT LEWIS: Well, you should be used to that by now.

HOWARD Listen, Mona.

MCHALE:

SCOTT LEWIS: June 25.

HOWARD We can talk about you scragging along the streets in Houston. Listen, we want to say hi-- do we have anyone else

MCHALE: we have to say hi to tonight? We missed out on a whole bunch.

MCHALE:

SCOTT LEWIS: Enjoying *After Hours*.

MCHALE:

HOWARD What's her name again?

MCHALE:

SCOTT LEWIS: Cindy, wasn't it?

MCHALE:

[APPLAUSE]

REPORTER: Harvey, do you have a few words for KPFT?

(SINGING) Coming out of hiding, looking for somebody like you. Coming out of hiding, coming on the run, coming for nobody but you.

Difficult as it is, you must tell your immediate family. You must tell your relatives. You must tell your friends if indeed they are your friends. You must tell your neighbors. You must tell the people you work with. You must tell the people in the stores.
