A quarter of a million now the child pornography Prevention Act of 1966 this is what it's called. And this new law vastly broadens the legal definition of kiddie pornography. And it really heightens the penalties and the federal definition of child pornography and this is what's important. Is has not been rewritten to include sexually suggestive drawings, paintings, and computer graphics as well as photographs that appear to represent imaginary people younger than 18 it also includes for all you straight folks out there gay lesbian couples that may have children bisexual couples that have children everybody has one of their favorite photographs of Jr. is the all on natural. Yeah, that can be defined as kiddie porno.

Also, also under this new law, now now here's what's very important. Where it appears to represent imaginary people younger than 18- if you have an obvious grown up-. Yeah, done up in a baby's diaper and adopt bottle that's called gag can be considered kiddie porn. If you have courts are gonna have to straighten if you have when, if you have it even goes so far as to being called, calling it suggestive. Oh, anything is suggestive, or erotically suggestive, such as the Calvin Klein ads. Now, this gets really, this gets really hairy. And there is another really important part of this, which is that this new law directly contradicts the standards that the Supreme Court laid down back in 82, you know, for banning sexually explicit depiction of minors, and that's what it said, sexually explicit pictures, photos of minor, and that was in Ferber V US. And the hike to heart- the Supreme Court ruled that it was the use of actual minors engaging in sexually explicit conduct that made those photos exception is, you know, exceptions to the First Amendment protection. Now, these, these new protracted images are what the new law targets and to make matters worse, the legislation has a provision specifically making it easier for police to search newsrooms in search of kiddie pornography newsrooms, right. And reporters who obtain a copy of an image prosecuted under new under the new law risk arrayed in their in their offices and years in prison. So this, we're having government control of the news media. Ladies and gentlemen, I don't know about you, but this smacks of fascism in the in the worst sort of way. And the news media, were too afraid to report it, but I'm not afraid. To give you an example, what's going on with this. In a related issue here, the Houston Police Department vice section was recently awarded \$400,000. In the first case of forfeiture of assets related to illegal sale and distribution of adult, obscene material. I do not want anybody, I do not want Pat Robertson, I do not want Jesse Helms, I do not want the president United States, I do not want the Pope to tell me what I can read as an adult in my own home. Right. Okay.
