Assault 18% aggravated assault, which means that the person had something in their hand, simple assault, they just use their hands. Aggravated assault means they had something in their hand, either a bottle or a stick or a gun or a knife or something. Okay, that came in at 13%. And, yeah. You know, just sort of really kind of sad that. You know, we have all this hate crime stuff going on. But we we need to keep reporting it.
