And I want to mention about bringing us a little bit home closer to home than Wyoming. 26 year old gay man here in Houston was savagely beaten and killed after he invited two men into his apartment in northeast Harris County, becoming at least the 28th gay man to be murdered in Texas since 1988. Now this happened six weeks before Matthew Shepard was killed. The victim's name is Joel Gerhardt. And he's been described as a friendly man who worked in a tuxedo store and also as a part time limousine driver. And he was so severely beaten in the face and the head during the early morning attack on August 27. That the authorities had to rely on dental records so identifying this guy was very horrendously beaten. Gerhardt met two young men. Yarmulke Steele, who was 24 and Yordan Bolanos 21, as he drove near his apartment at the 18,000 block of poppy trails in northeast Harris County, and the two men were invited into Earhart's apartment where the two men began beating him both inside and outside the apartment. Both suspects have been arrested and arraigned and are awaiting trial at this time. So these hate crime killings do not occur just in some out of the way it plays. They do happen even here in Houston.
