To a bee I'll not mention the names and 5784 to the airlines, the court imposes upon you 800 special assessment the court imposes upon you five years supervises supervised release simply because the law requires it that the licenses are real licenses. We do not sign documents with terrorists. We hunt them down one by one and bring them to justice. So war talk is way out of line in this court. You are big fellow but you are not that big. You're no warrior. I know warrior. Here's your terrorist, a species of criminal guilty of multiple attempted murders, and a very real sense. Trooper Santiago had it right when you were first taken off that plane and into custody. You wondered where the press and where the TV crews were? And he said, You're no big deal. You are no big deal. What you're able counsel and what equally able United States Attorneys have grappled with. And what I have as honest, as I know how tried to grapple with is why you did something so horrific. What was it that led you here to this courtroom today? I have listened respectfully to what you had to say.
