He said it distressed him to see that Medicare recipients are being denied services that provide them with a normal life. In the case of the case of HIV and AIDS, recipients are living longer due to the prescribed drugs. But a lot of these drugs create enormous side effects, some of which can be controlled by physical therapy. So they provide physical therapy for HIV AIDS, patients, clients, and there's a cap, there's a Medicaid cap of \$1,500. So these people can't get the physical therapy they need. At the same time, the Medicare said they were going to look at this. Congress said they were going to look at this. They've been stopped. They're busy trying to

impeach people and throw people out of office they're not working on. So you can call your Senator, you can call your congressman in Washington and tell them, hey, get to work on this thing. And let's get this cap off and let's provide information for people. Okay. All right.

Okay, getting back to Texas, some 271 people are about 65% of the 414 Gay discharges in the Air Force were trainees at the Lackland Air Force Base in San Antonio. And this brings to 30%. It's an a 30% increase in the number of people that have been removed from the Air Force, which was part of a record number of expulsions in 1998. Under the Pentagon official policy, in 1998. There was 1100 45 people discharged in the military. Under the Don't Ask, Don't Tell, in 1994, just five years ago, there was only 617. When I first started at the station, about five years ago, it was the number was 617. That number is just about doubled to 1100 45.
