And I told that person to call me back. And they did in about 40 minutes. And I had that answer. So we make a very concerted effort to find the answers so that we're we're there for you and very informed and very aware of what's going on. And Diana and Pat are some of the leaders of the switchboard some of the people who keep it going and keep it healthy and invigorated and happy. And even though Sara over here is a member of switchboard, we a lot of switchboard people participate in after hours. And a lot of after hours people participate in the switchboard. So you can see that that's almost family down here with this. What is it now did I want to do? Let's see, you talked about training, talked about how long it was, you talked will tell me a little bit about what goes on. So if I don't know, and I'm uncomfortable, but tell me a little bit that that goes on at training. I mean, you get to know another bunch of people
