And here in Houston, because we've got what three times four times the population of New Orleans, we've got those HOV lanes and we built the the double walled the permanent, you know, the one lane that sits there unused half to two thirds of the day. And unfortunately, they couldn't figure out I guess how to structurally take apart enough of the one side wall and the other side wall and make a smooth lane of traffic out of it. And that's why all of our counterflow lanes started in Conroe or just outside of Katy where the HOV lanes ended. And they could swerve over easily because I mean, like I heard the Katy Freeway their HOV when they started counterflow. You had to be in the HOV lane actually, to get into counterflow and move over. So it's been a wild time.

Normally it's 630 in the morning to 90 eastbound is packed. And I got to 290 and it was 290 westbound that was packed though. Bumper To Bumper, you weren't moving. There's people out of their car standing there. And you know, when you see it on TV, it's one thing but when you witness it in person, it's another and then today coming in, there was no

traffic. I got on at half the people left, I got on at Hofmeister and at you know, five o'clock on a Friday afternoon. I must have only seen a dozen cars on the road. My. And it was just, I actually think there was a dozen cars that were driving. I live so far out. I'm outside of safe, clear territory. So I must have seen 20 cars are parked on the side of the road that were abandoned. Yeah, because of either car problems or because of running out of gas. Well, that's
