at 4am Central Daylight Time tropical storm warning is discontinued south of Port O'Connor, Texas. A tropical storm warning remains in effect for the south eastern coast of Louisiana, east of Morgan City to the mouth of the Pearl River, including metropolitan New Orleans and Lake Pontchartrain, and from south of Sargent, Texas to Port O'Connor, Texas. A tropical storm warning means the tropical storm conditions are expected within the warning area within the next 24 hours. At 4am. The center of Hurricane Rita was located near latitude to 9.9 North longitude. Nine West or near Port Arthur Texas. Route is moving towards the northwest near 12 miles per hour, a gradual turn towards the north, and a decrease in forward motion is expected during the next 24 hours. This motion should bring the center of Rita further inland over southeastern Texas earlier later today. Reports from Air Force Reserve hurricane hunter aircraft and National Weather Service Doppler radars indicate that maximum sustained winds are near 120 miles an hour with higher gusts. This makes Rita a category three hurricane on the SAFFiR Simpson scale. So repeating again it's at 29.9 North 93.9 West movement is the northwest at 12 miles per hour. Sustained maximum sustained wind is 120 miles per hour. central pressure 937 millibars next advisory from the National Hurricane Center will be at 7am followed by a complete advisory at 10am This concludes your hurricane update

One thing there was some fires have been breaking out in Clear Lake Galveston Pasadena. Part of that, you know, power lines going down causing sparks. The winds are causing transformers to explode. Right now that band of storms that we said that we're sevens and eights that were in Liberty County, Central and East is now to West Liberty County. And it's one of those bands off of Rita which is heading here. The western edge of it is just outside the Beltway on the northwest side. So if you are up by Intercontinental Airport expect you know some of the sevens and eights coming your way. There's also a band of sevens with small amounts of eights. Basically running southwest from Sugar Land down to the coast is what it looks like there. Most other places you are in the fours and fives there's a little patch of six up in the outside the grand Parkway Northwest between Katie and Tom ball. And like I said for the rest of the list. Think area you're mainly the fours and fives until you get out to the far expanses on the west there and now sudden Brian I'm you're down into the threes. So just be careful out there if you don't need to be out on the road stay at home, we're remain the shelter in place because all this water coming in and wind with it, the wind with it too. It's it's not the best type of driving it is especially if you're in one of those taller vehicles, you're going to get hit with some of those cross winds.
