When young nurse summed it up when she said it was a rare privilege to work under you during your tenure as Chief Nurse. I waited a long time that trenches for your kind of nurse to come along You are an inspiration for all of us. It's my sad duty to read I'm gonna read to you at this time, Colin Campbell Meyer has proven to be a great asset to both the active and reserve component, the medical profession as a whole. She's constantly provided superb leadership and has many outstanding accomplishments to accredit both military and civilian. Notwithstanding the board finds that Colonel Margaret Campbell Meyer is a homosexual as defined in AR 135 Dash 175. And as evidenced dot by her admission under oath to this board that she's a lesbian. We recommend that Colonel Kim Myers federate federal recognition to be withdrawn. In the event that subsequent action results in her discharge from the USA are an honorable discharge certificate should be awarded. We are aware that the DoD policy on homosexuality is currently under review. If the review results in change, these recommendations should be re examined. Oh, goodness, that's, that's, that's a contradiction. That's just a contradiction. The first part of this whole report says what a wonderful person she is. And then it goes on to read that because someone somewhere thinks that homos are bad folks, she has to step down. I'm gonna read this one paragraph that are a bit of this one paragraph that says during her military career cameraman was awarded the Bronze Star for service in Vietnam, was named Veterans Administration nurse of the year in 1985. And as the chief the position of Chief Nurse for the Washington State National Guard. Ironically, her commitment to the military and our country, ultimately was her undoing. In order to help as many people as she could come on, I aspire to be Chief Nurse for the US National Guard. To do that she had to enroll in the Army War College to earn credentials that would support her candidacy for that position. To enter the war college candidates are required to obtain top secret clearance. There's a place on the application where it's asked whether or not you have done something morally inappropriate, or something like that, to which I said no, says camera Meyer. But then in an interview, the question was whether you were a homosexual? And that's not the same question. I don't consider my sexual orientation, that of being lesbian as being morally inappropriate. And basically, this woman had never really identified herself as a lesbian. I mean, she identified herself as as being gay as being lesbian as a homosexual. But she wasn't really out. I mean, she may have been out to, of course, her lover and her family and friends, but she was not an outspoken lesbian. And because she wanted to do something to help more, more more people than she was helping already. She had to say, Yes, I'm a lesbian when asked because you don't lie about that kind of stuff to get tax top secret clearance. And so now, she gets dismissed. Can you believe that? Can you believe that jewel just now walk in the controller? Because I've been seeing her alone. For so while
