Their present Republican presidential candidates are so busy fighting about who can and cannot serve in the military. They must have forgotten that we actually value who we fight for, says the 32nd ad produced by the Human Rights Campaign, a Washington based advocacy group. Their big argument is about cohesion in the military, and all this. We're not too sure in the time of battle. Well, I got some actual numbers here from the Houston Chronicle and it is from the I'm January 14 edition of the Chronicles on Section A page 35. And it says that the Navy discharged only 483 men and lesbians, about half its national annual average in 1950. At the height of the Korean War, and about 1461 During in 1970, during the Vietnam War, during the Persian Gulf War, the Pentagon issued a stop loss order preventing discharges on the basis of gay orientation until after the fighting was over. Opponents of lifting the band said the Pentagon reduces gay discharges during the war to prevent homeless heterosexuals from escaping military service by pretending to be gay. You know, whether many Americans know it or not to say the military could simply look within for another test of workability of units with members who are frank about being gay, because some commanders are tolerant of homosexuality. There are large pockets in the military where gays already serve openly and overall, these operations functions at least as well as any other air I'll be very honest.
