Among men, 18% said that they had physically assaulted or threatened someone they thought was a gay or lesbian. And another 32% admitted that they were guilty of verbal harassment. The figures were a lot less for women. Many explain their actions is self defense, which Miss Franklin said that was based on their perception that gays are sexual predators. Others were thrill seekers or simply went along with their peers.
