And a couple of weeks ago, while we were out in Montrose doing outreach, of course, we were on a condo because it was so many girls out here. The men, the cabins from us, I went into the clubs, I wanted to all the gay clubs that's in the Montrose area. And out of either gay clubs, I was only able to get eight condoms, which upsetting me, okay, because it was like when I wanted to do one club, this one gay, flamboyant Queen at ohs told me, honey, I don't want those condoms. They're a mess. MILLIKEN messing up on my thing on her little shelf where she takes her money, whatever. And I'm like, so did you care about people getting sick out in the streets? Today was not her problem. Goodness, goodness. Yeah. And it was really a sad situation. So I'm glad that I'm glad that I can be able to do what I can you know, what little resource I have for the transgender community out there in the streets.

Right, exactly. Like there's a lot of girls out there that do have HIV, and they are working the streets, and they are there. And there's a lot of girls that I know that do have the disease.
