And you get a sense of role models, which we divide us up. I mean, what really hurts me about Harvey Milk? Is that, that he, at this juncture, maybe in 20 years, they will do enough in depth biographical work on Harvey Milk, so that he has three dimensions, but right now he's basically a painting. He's a two dimensional as a role model. He and what a wonderful, exciting world he could help create, and we are being denied many of our important role models right now. This is a real hard time for for role models. And so that's why I want you to read that. I can't I'm not the end all to everything. But I have learned to listen and feel and you have learned to broadcast information and emotion And that has reinforced people. So it does work. But he's playing his role. I think I'm beginning to learn what my role is. And the rest

of the crew down here that make after hours work or playing their role. Your role right now is to call the number and make the pledge, but it need not long before.
