You know, it doesn't say, you know, your, your, your, are you male or female or transgender male to female, transgender female or male? No, it simply says, Are you male or female? Exactly. Okay. So when we talk about, you know, just being overall sensitive, that is one of the things that was always a key point for me to bring forth during the during the show.
