HOWARD
MCHALE: Me too.

LESLIE: --or Lebanese or anything.

HOWARD
MCHALE: OK. Give us the stats. Tall-- height, age?

HOWARD
MCHALE: Searching for?

LESLIE: OK, what I'm searching for? OK. A woman between 35 and 45.

HOWARD
MCHALE: Yes.

MCHALE:

HOWARD Born in Houston?

MCHALE:

HOWARD What kind of line of work you in?

MCHALE:

MCHALE:

MCHALE:

HOWARD Oh, no men at all?

MCHALE:

LESLIE: No men at all.

HOWARD Oh.

MCHALE:

LESLIE: True blue here.

HOWARD Hey, I tell you. So you don't believe in penile penetration, huh?

MCHALE:

[MUSIC PLAYING]

LESLIE: Can we talk?

HOWARD We are talking, girl.

MCHALE:

LESLIE: Uh-huh. Get off the line. I mean, get off the air.

HOWARD How tall are you?

MCHALE:

LESLIE: Oh, 5'6.

HOWARD 5'6. 36. So kind of looking-- any success anywhere meeting women have you found out?

MCHALE:

LESLIE: Yeah.

HOWARD Besides bowling alleys.

MCHALE:

LESLIE: Yeah. You know, I just, I don't want to do the bar thing. And of course, I don't have that many outlets hobby wise.

HOWARD What do you look like?

MCHALE:

LESLIE: What do I look like?

HOWARD Yeah.

MCHALE:

LESLIE: Fair skinned. Not super pretty, but middle of the road. I'm femme. Well, people say I'm femme.

HOWARD You sound wonderful. I want to go out with you.

MCHALE:

LESLIE: Thanks. I love animals, so if the woman has animals, that's fine.

HOWARD What is your favorite--

MCHALE:

SCOTT LEWIS: God, Leslie, I want to go out with you. We should do her together.

HOWARD OK. I have one question, one last question and we'll move on.

MCHALE:

LESLIE: OK.

HOWARD What is your favorite flavor of snow cone?

MCHALE:

LESLIE: Oh, Hawaiian. The blue one.

HOWARD Oh. A woman from my heart.

MCHALE:

SCOTT LEWIS: Leslie, we have your phone number. Is it all right if we call you back if we find a connection?

LESLIE: Oh, sure.

SCOTT LEWIS: OK. Stay tuned.

LESLIE: All right.

SCOTT LEWIS: We have a long distance caller.

HOWARD From?

MCHALE:

SCOTT LEWIS: I don't know. We'll find out.

HOWARD Uh-huh.

MCHALE:

SCOTT LEWIS: Caller, are you there?

SCOTT LEWIS: Is this Chuck?

CHUCK: Yeah.

CHUCK: Texas City.

HOWARD Texas City.

MCHALE:

SCOTT LEWIS: Is that long distance?

CHUCK: Yeah, it's down by Galveston

HOWARD Oh, OK.

MCHALE:

SCOTT LEWIS: Oh. Are you close to the ocean?

CHUCK: Yeah.

HOWARD Hey, stick the phone out so we can hear the seagulls, OK? Well, I want to hear the ocean.

MCHALE:

SCOTT LEWIS: Yeah, well, you can hear it between your ears. So Chuck, what are you looking for?

CHUCK: A husband.

SCOTT LEWIS: Aren't we all? Stand in line.

HOWARD Don't we have any straight people calling tonight?

MCHALE:

SCOTT LEWIS: Oh, well, they have their own show.

HOWARD Oh, that's right.

MCHALE:

SCOTT LEWIS: It's with Chuck Woolery, but we're better looking. So what's your idea? What exact-- when you say you want a husband, do you want a husband? You want the monogamous, let's move in together, bring over a U-Haul with all your stuff or?

CHUCK: Oh, no, not that quick. I mean, I just want someone--

SCOTT LEWIS: I mean, is that your ultimate goal or?

CHUCK: Well, yeah.

HOWARD How old are you, Chuck?

MCHALE:

CHUCK: My ultimate goal is to get married in the Roman Catholic Church.

HOWARD Yeah.

MCHALE:

SCOTT LEWIS: Oh.

MCHALE:

CHUCK: I'm 23.

HOWARD 23. Nice age. Nice age.

MCHALE:

SCOTT LEWIS: Very nice. That's my age.

HOWARD Yeah, it is.

MCHALE:

CHUCK: I called in a couple months ago.

HOWARD I'm sorry?

MCHALE:

CHUCK: I called in a couple months ago. Remember you asked me the question about OJ and I said I don't care?

HOWARD Uh-huh. We still don't care.

MCHALE:

SCOTT LEWIS: We still don't care.

CHUCK: Yeah.

HOWARD Yeah. OK. Looking for a man between the ages of?

MCHALE:

CHUCK: It doesn't matter. Anywhere between 18 and 35.

SCOTT LEWIS: Oh, you're in my category.

HOWARD So if you were in the military and in the barracks you had to pick a bunk, would you pick the top bunk or the

MCHALE: bottom bunk?

CHUCK: Probably both. I don't care.

HOWARD OK. Let me tell you--

MCHALE:

SCOTT LEWIS: What, your address?

HOWARD That blue handkerchief that you wear when you go out, what side of the pocket do you carry it in, Chuck?

MCHALE:

CHUCK: I don't wear a blue handkerchief when I go out.

SCOTT LEWIS: He has no clue.

HOWARD Uh-oh. Must be the '70s again. Forget I asked that.

MCHALE:

SCOTT LEWIS: It's an old gay thing, Chuck.

CHUCK: OK.

HOWARD Yeah, Chuck. Kind of like handlebar mustaches and-- yeah, you wouldn't get it.

MCHALE:

SCOTT LEWIS: You're listening to Scott Lewis and Howard Big Daddy McHale on After Hours, a continuing tradition on KPFT Houston 90.1 FM. Have to do that at the top of the hour. So Chuck, what would you do the first time, the first date?

MCHALE:

CHUCK: But so far the lover department hasn't worked out quite well.

HOWARD Hey, rejoice. Let me tell you, it happens to all of us once or twice. So give us a little stats about you. What do you look like? What do you-- how tall are you?

MCHALE:

[AUDIO OUT]

HOWARD No? Sound like a jock? Does he sound like a jock, Scott?

MCHALE:

CHUCK: Well, I do have a cold or something.

HOWARD Oh. Well, get that thermometer out of your mouth. You're on the air.

MCHALE:

SCOTT LEWIS: What size shoe do you wear?

CHUCK: 13.

SCOTT LEWIS: Oh.

HOWARD Oh, Chuck, we have a winner. We have a winner.

MCHALE:

CHUCK: Yeah, but last time I told you that you asked for my glove size too.

HOWARD Oh, is that so? Well, we're only on feet tonight.

MCHALE:

SCOTT LEWIS: We don't care about your glove size.

HOWARD Oh, Chuck, you're an animal. What a beast.

MCHALE:

SCOTT LEWIS: I tell you, Chuck, I think we just give Chuck our address.

HOWARD I know. How old is he again?

MCHALE:

CHUCK: 23.

HOWARD Oh, that's right. That's a nice age. That's a real nice age. So Chuck, any luck in the love department at all?

MCHALE:

CHUCK: No.

HOWARD OK. On the air tonight, tell us-- you're talking to all of Houston on the air tonight. Pretend like you're talking to

MCHALE: that person and invite that person into your life. What would you say? Come on.

CHUCK: Oh, God. Oh, I don't even get to rehearse or anything.

HOWARD That's right, Chuck. This is impromptu.

MCHALE:

CHUCK: I don't know. Come on.

HOWARD Come on, come on.

MCHALE:

CHUCK: First of all, I don't want anybody in the closet or anything like that.

HOWARD We're not saying that--

MCHALE:

SCOTT LEWIS: Good for you.

HOWARD We want you to invite someone right now into your life. You're on the air. It's your spotlight, baby. Come on.

MCHALE:

CHUCK: Well, I don't-- I don't know. Really, I don't just-- come on in. Give me a call.

HOWARD OK.

MCHALE:

CHUCK: I don't know.

HOWARD 23 years old, 6 foot 4. Do you work out?

MCHALE:

SCOTT LEWIS: Size 13 shoe.

CHUCK: Yeah.

HOWARD You work out?

MCHALE:

CHUCK: Yes.

HOWARD Do you sail down there in Texas City?

MCHALE:

CHUCK: No.

HOWARD Ever hit the ocean? Volleyball?

MCHALE:

CHUCK: Not really volleyball, but I go down there.

HOWARD Do you chew bubble gum or non-bubble gum?

MCHALE:

CHUCK: I don't get it.

HOWARD I'm asking you--

MCHALE:

CHUCK: I guess bubble gum

HOWARD --when you chew gum, your favorite flavor of bubble gum.

MCHALE:

CHUCK: Bubble gum flavor.

HOWARD Yeah, what a beast.

MCHALE:

SCOTT LEWIS: Chuck, they have your number up front?

CHUCK: Yes, they do.

SCOTT LEWIS: OK, Chuck.

HOWARD Bye.

MCHALE:

SCOTT LEWIS: We're going to start looking for you.

CHUCK: OK.

SCOTT LEWIS: I tell you, wild and crazy kids on the line tonight. 526-573-8526. KPFT.

HOWARD If you think about it, what an opportunity to get on the radio and ask someone into your life.

MCHALE:

SCOTT LEWIS: Chuck, you blew it. So who do we have here? Do we have-- I'm trying to look over everybody we've talked to so far, and do we have somebody-- well, Vic--

HOWARD Shh. You're not supposed to say her name.

MCHALE:

SCOTT LEWIS: Yeah, somebody-- I think we lost her.

HOWARD Victoria, are you still there?

MCHALE:

SCOTT LEWIS: And I don't know that we have a connection yet. Sheldon and Christopher. We might try to get the two of them on a conference call and see where that goes, and we've got several more calls holding. And you can get in on it right now at 526-573-8526. KPFT.

HOWARD Hey, let's go to another line. Oh, let's go to line six.

MCHALE:

SCOTT LEWIS: OK.

HOWARD OK?

MCHALE:

SCOTT LEWIS: We can't because we don't have anybody to go in there and push the button.

HOWARD I'm going to go push the buttons while I'm tied up here. Hey, who's that little boy in here? What's his name?

MCHALE:

SCOTT LEWIS: I don't know. Come here. What's your name, little boy? A little boy just walked in.

HOWARD Yeah, go get someone to punch our buttons in here, would you?

MCHALE:

SCOTT LEWIS: What's your name? He's confused.

HOWARD Matt, will you stay in there, please?

MCHALE:

SCOTT LEWIS: Matt, who is that?

CREW: [INAUDIBLE]

SCOTT LEWIS: Alan?

HOWARD Oh, Alan.

MCHALE:

SCOTT LEWIS: Alan, what are you up to?

ALAN: Answering the phones.

HOWARD Oh.

MCHALE:

SCOTT LEWIS: Alan is-- how old are you, Alan?

ALAN: 11.

SCOTT LEWIS: Alan is 11 answering the phone. The Christians are going nuts right now. And what's your name? Robin?

HOWARD Robin.

MCHALE:

SCOTT LEWIS: How old are you? 13.

HOWARD 13.

MCHALE:

SCOTT LEWIS: Are you brother and sister? I could tell by the matching glasses. What are you--

HOWARD They're such cute kids.

MCHALE:

SCOTT LEWIS: What are you guys-- shouldn't you all be in bed somewhere? No? Oh, Robin says, no, no, not at all. What are you guys doing down here tonight? Who's your mom?

ALAN: Evelyn.

HOWARD Evelyn, couldn't you tell?

MCHALE:

SCOTT LEWIS: Oh, Evelyn is-- you know, you look just like your mother.

HOWARD Yeah. What a wonderful woman.

MCHALE:

SCOTT LEWIS: I didn't know Evelyn was here. And she dragged the kids in. Well, the-- see, now the lines are really lighting up. All the Christians are calling in going, you're polluting the children's mind. So obviously you know your mother is involved with women, right? Does that-- how does that affect you? Do you think about that at school or anything? Has it caused any problems or anything?

MCHALE:

SCOTT LEWIS: It's like *Heather Has Two Mommies*.

HOWARD Yeah, it's kind of like lots of Christmas presents.

MCHALE:

SCOTT LEWIS: How is it different-- is it different in any way-- is your father-- you stay with your father. Does he have a girlfriend or anything? And so how is--

ALAN: He's married.

SCOTT LEWIS: Oh, he's married, so you have a stepmom. How is it different over at your mother's house versus your father's house besides just that there's two moms?

CREW: We can't hear them.

SCOTT LEWIS: Can't hear who?

CREW: Whoever you're-- do you have somebody on the line?

SCOTT LEWIS: No, we're talking to these two kids right here. We're talking to Evelyn's kids.

HOWARD Here comes Evelyn.

MCHALE:

SCOTT LEWIS: Here comes Evelyn.

HOWARD Hey, Evelyn, get over there and push the buttons, will you?

MCHALE:

SCOTT LEWIS: So how is it different, you guys, from being at your dad's house to your mom's house? Other than that your mom, there's two moms. I mean, is there anything really different? Yeah. What-- talk right in there.

ALAN: See, we get to stay up later and have--

SCOTT LEWIS: At your mom's house?

ALAN: Mhm. And we get a lot more stuff.

SCOTT LEWIS: So your mom and your mom and her lover are cooler than your dad. Your dad's not listening, is he? Good, so you can say this.

ALAN: My dad's kind of old, you know?

SCOTT LEWIS: Kind of old, nerd-ish.

HOWARD Old, over 30.

MCHALE:

SCOTT LEWIS: He's about to be 40. So is Howard.

HOWARD I am not. Why are you always picking on my age?

MCHALE:

SCOTT LEWIS: So what do you do when you go out-- do you all go on outings and stuff to Astroworld or anything? I mean--

EVELYN: We're going to Dave & Buster's tomorrow.

SCOTT LEWIS: You're going to Dave & Buster's tomorrow? Ooh-la-la. Do they let you go in the gambling room? No? OK.

ALAN: I can-- I know how to sneak in there now.

SCOTT LEWIS: Oh.

HOWARD Don't you be sneaking in there, and don't you start smoking cigarettes either.

MCHALE:

SCOTT LEWIS: I know, it'll ruin your life.

HOWARD Bye, kids.

MCHALE:

SCOTT LEWIS: Bye, guys. Thanks for coming in. That's great. Go in there and punch a button, Evelyn. Just pick anyone. We don't care.

HOWARD Oh, what cute kids.

MCHALE:

SCOTT LEWIS: Those are great kids. The Christians are going nuts.

HOWARD Hey, Evelyn, hit six for us, would you, please?

MCHALE:

EVELYN: [INAUDIBLE]

SCOTT LEWIS: Well, hit anything. Hit one that's blinking. Did you hit one? Caller, are you there?

BILL: Yeah, I'm here.

SCOTT LEWIS: Who's this?

BILL: This is Bill.

SCOTT LEWIS: Bill.

HOWARD Hey, Bill. How are you?

MCHALE:

SCOTT LEWIS: Bill. I don't even--

BILL: All right, how are you?

SCOTT LEWIS: --have a paper on Bill.

BILL: I was having a good conversation with Matt.

SCOTT LEWIS: With Matt? Well, what the hell are you doing talking to us then?

HOWARD Well, hang up then and talk to Matt.

MCHALE:

SCOTT LEWIS: Hang up and call back.

BILL: Well, no, I originally called to talk to--

SCOTT LEWIS: To who? What happened?

CREW: I thought you said hang up and call back. I just--

SCOTT LEWIS: Oh, he wanted to talk to-- caller, are you there?

SANDY: Yes.

SCOTT LEWIS: Oh, who's this?

SANDY: Sandy.

HOWARD Hi, Sandy.

MCHALE:

SCOTT LEWIS: Sandy. I don't have a page on Sandy either. Oh, my God, we're getting so far behind. Sandy, what are you up to tonight?

SANDY: I'm listening to y'all and just watching a little bit of TV.

SCOTT LEWIS: Oh, yeah? What's on?

SANDY: Oh, watching Lifestyle Of The Rich And Famous.

SCOTT LEWIS: Oh.

SANDY: It's turned down. I'm listening to y'all. Y'all are doing real cool tonight.

HOWARD Hey, we're always cool. We're always cool.

MCHALE:

SCOTT LEWIS: So are you looking for a man or a woman, Sandy?

SANDY: Well, I've already met a connection. I just wanted-- I know she's listening and I wanted to say hi and I love her. I want her to call me.

HOWARD Oh.

MCHALE:

SCOTT LEWIS: And who's that?

SANDY: Her name is Jennifer.

HOWARD Hi, Jennifer.

MCHALE:

SCOTT LEWIS: And did you meet her here?

SANDY: Yeah.

SCOTT LEWIS: And now this is great. So did you meet her on our last show or?

SANDY: Yeah, it's been about a month.

SCOTT LEWIS: OK, that was on our last show.

HOWARD Uh-huh.

MCHALE:

SCOTT LEWIS: And so what did you do on your first date?

SANDY: Well, we watched movies till about 8:00 in the morning.

HOWARD Was it romantic?

MCHALE:

SCOTT LEWIS: What did you watch? *Sleepless in Seattle* or?

SANDY: No, we watched Clint Eastwood and--

HOWARD Oh, that's real butch.

MCHALE:

[INTERPOSING VOICES]

SANDY: --and the movie called *The Rookie*.

HOWARD Oh, OK.

MCHALE:

SANDY: Yeah, it's pretty cool. It's pretty--

HOWARD So good date, huh? Good date?

MCHALE:

SANDY: Yeah, and then we crashed out and then the exterminator woke us up and he had to come spray. And then we hung around together and then she left and then been hanging out with each other off and on.

HOWARD Yay. How nice.

MCHALE:

SCOTT LEWIS: That is--

SANDY: She works graveyards all weekend. All weekend she works graveyards.

HOWARD Uh-huh.

MCHALE:

SCOTT LEWIS: So she's listening now, probably.

SANDY: Yeah, she should be. She's probably getting on her rounds about 1:30.

HOWARD Hey, Jennifer. How are you?

MCHALE:

SCOTT LEWIS: Sandy, that is great. Congratulations.

SANDY: Yeah. I'm happy.

HOWARD Once in a while.

MCHALE:

SANDY: [INAUDIBLE].

HOWARD Oh.

MCHALE:

SCOTT LEWIS: Oh. Different kind of flower.

SANDY: We spend from Tuesday morning about 1:00 AM till maybe Thursday together.

HOWARD Yeah, how wonderful. Invite us to the wedding.

MCHALE:

SCOTT LEWIS: That's right.

SANDY: Oh, no, no, no we're not gone that far yet.

HOWARD Hey, no.

MCHALE:

SANDY: She goes home and takes care of a little bit of business, takes care of the cat, and comes back over and we hang out together.

HOWARD Oh, that is so sweet.

MCHALE:

SANDY: We watch movies. We're into a lot of good movies and a lot of the same music and lot of same food.

HOWARD Well, listen, Sandy--

MCHALE:

SANDY: I haven't done it-- I mean, I took her out to eat one time. Taco Bell.

SCOTT LEWIS: Ooh, big spender.

HOWARD My best dates have been Taco Bell. They worked in the kitchen.

MCHALE:

SCOTT LEWIS: Sandy, thanks so much for calling and congratulations. We're glad for you. Glad things are still working out a month later.

HOWARD Keep it up.

MCHALE:

SCOTT LEWIS: I wish I could say the same thing. Can we get the second one?

HOWARD Seven.

MCHALE:

SCOTT LEWIS: The second. That's the one. Caller, are you there?

HOWARD I think they hung up.

MCHALE:

SCOTT LEWIS: Caller?

RAY: Hello.

HOWARD Hello.

MCHALE:

SCOTT LEWIS: Hi.

RAY: Yes. My name is Ray.

HOWARD Hi, Ray.

MCHALE:

RAY: How you doing?

SCOTT LEWIS: You're on the air.

RAY: All right, I'm calling from work.

HOWARD You sound like you're in a payphone.

MCHALE:

RAY: No, I'm actually on a guard shack. I'm a security officer.

HOWARD Yeah, yeah. What you guarding there, baby?

MCHALE:

RAY: Well, an apartment complex.

HOWARD Hey, OK.

MCHALE:

SCOTT LEWIS: OK.

HOWARD Hey, what's the going rate for a two bedroom out there?

MCHALE:

SCOTT LEWIS: I hope not my apartment complex. If you are, get back over there. Somebody's breaking in.

RAY: I don't think it is.

SCOTT LEWIS: I know--

RAY: But I enjoy your show. I listen all the time because I work strictly graveyard shift, so I always listen every Saturday night.

HOWARD Oh, you poor guy.
MCHALE:

SCOTT LEWIS: Oh, do you? What's on your mind tonight, Ray?

RAY: Well, I was calling about a meeting a connection, or maybe more than one connection at different times.

SCOTT LEWIS: Do you-- I'm glad you pointed that out.

HOWARD You mean two at the same time?
MCHALE:

SCOTT LEWIS: No.

RAY: No, at different times.

SCOTT LEWIS: At different times.

RAY: Definitely different times.

SCOTT LEWIS: Are you looking for a man or a woman?

RAY: Oh, definitely a man.

HOWARD Oh.
MCHALE:

SCOTT LEWIS: Oh, I just love that confidence and--

HOWARD We didn't mean to harass you there.
MCHALE:

RAY: No. I'm definitely into the big, muscular football player type.

HOWARD Well, how old are you?
MCHALE:

RAY: I'm 41.

HOWARD Are you a big muscular type?
MCHALE:

RAY: No, unfortunately I'm not. I'm an admirer.

SCOTT LEWIS: Me either. Me either.

RAY: I'm an admirer of that. I am big, but I'm not that muscular. I'm a African-American man. I'm 5 feet 9 inches tall. I have a very smooth dark brown or chocolate complexion. Totally clean shaven, military hairstyle. I'm, let's say, at least--

HOWARD One butch dude, huh?

MCHALE:

RAY: Right. Well, I'm relatively butch.

SCOTT LEWIS: What size shoes?

RAY: About an 11.

HOWARD Mm.

MCHALE:

SCOTT LEWIS: Hmm, nice size.

RAY: And I weigh probably somewhere in the 240 range.

HOWARD Oh, how tall are you again?

MCHALE:

RAY: I'm 5 feet 9. I'm heavy.

HOWARD No, that's OK.

MCHALE:

RAY: Yeah.

HOWARD That's OK.

MCHALE:

SCOTT LEWIS: That's what Howard likes.

HOWARD Mhm.

MCHALE:

SCOTT LEWIS: Howard's putting you over on his separate sheet over there.

HOWARD That's right.

MCHALE:

RAY: OK. I was kind of interested in talking-- or giving you my number of the air so that maybe Sheldon and the other young man, I think, called. I think there was one that just got out of the military.

HOWARD Are you looking for white boys or is race--

MCHALE:

[INTERPOSING VOICES]

RAY: Race is not a factor.

HOWARD That's not a factor.

MCHALE:

RAY: I get the guys that are very beefy.

HOWARD
MCHALE: OK.

RAY: When I say beefy I mean not necessarily chiseled body, Coca-Cola type person, but just the guys with big, muscular arms and chest and legs and things like that. But it doesn't have to be like a person that just trying to be like a Coke bottle and the person that would be it, but more like the football player type.

HOWARD
MCHALE: Mhm. Mhm. Mhm. OK, now, before we leave you-- we got your phone number up front.

RAY: OK.

HOWARD
MCHALE: If I took three your coworkers and put them together and I said, describe you, how would they describe you?
What kind of person would they describe?

RAY: As physically?

HOWARD
MCHALE: Physically and mentally?

RAY: OK. Physically they would say I was heavy. You know, I'm a heavy person. As far as personality goes, I get along-- I'm a Leo. I get along very much-- I get along good with everybody. I'm very easygoing, sort of like I guess you could say laid back type person.

HOWARD
MCHALE: Uh-huh. Well, that sounds like fun. Great.

RAY: Those are characteristics that-- I'm not a hothead or a smart alec or anything like that.

HOWARD
MCHALE: Just a down to Earth, bubba, huh?

RAY: Right.

HOWARD
MCHALE: You've got it. You got it. Well, we got to be connecting him to. Thank you for calling.

RAY: I was going to--

HOWARD
MCHALE: Uh-huh?

RAY: Also mention that I'm home a lot during the day. Anybody can call me. Like if you give my-- and you could give my number out to different guys that have told you that the type of people that I am. I'm going to give you my home number that I can be reached any time between 8:00 AM and 8:00 PM daily.

HOWARD
MCHALE: Excellent. Excellent. Listen, we got your number. We're keeping you on your love connection sheet.

RAY: OK.

HOWARD Thanks.

MCHALE:

SCOTT LEWIS: Thanks for calling.

RAY: And thank you. I'll continue listening to your show.

HOWARD Great. Thank you.

MCHALE:

SCOTT LEWIS: You are listening to Scott Lewis and Howard Big Daddy McHale on After Hours, a continuing tradition here at KPFT Houston. Big Daddy, the lines are just going crazy.

HOWARD They're going crazy.

MCHALE:

CREW: Well, you know how it is with those lesbians. They got those nimble fingers. She was-- Evelyn was fixing to put someone on the air and she hung up on them instead because those fingers were just dancing across the board. So Victoria, you need to call back.

HOWARD Victoria, call back.

MCHALE:

SCOTT LEWIS: I think we've hung up on her about three or four times.

HOWARD Four times How come he's got Frito breath and he keeps talking close to me.

MCHALE:

SCOTT LEWIS: Maybe that one that just called in because I think that might be the person we've hung up on about four times tonight. Is it? Let's take that one then.

HOWARD OK, get her on the air.

MCHALE:

MARTHA: --about three or four weeks ago--

SCOTT LEWIS: Caller, are you there?

MARTHA: Yeah. Yes. I--

HOWARD Who are you talking to you, girl?

MCHALE:

SCOTT LEWIS: Girl, she's just going on. Who's this?

MARTHA: This is Martha, and I had spoken to y'all about three or four weeks ago.

HOWARD Uh-huh.

MCHALE:

MARTHA: And so yeah, on the previous love connection, and I talked to Terry on the line with y'all and I talked about flowers. Well, she did the cool thing is that she sent me a dozen roses at work.

HOWARD
MCHALE: No way. Oh, how wonderful.

MARTHA: Yes way. It was a real good way to start out the week because it's on a Monday morning. I got these flowers at work at the office, but she never called.

HOWARD
MCHALE: Huh.

MARTHA: And I mean, she really should call me. She wouldn't be disappointed.

HOWARD
MCHALE: Do you think that maybe she thought she would be disappointed?

MARTHA: Well, no.

HOWARD
MCHALE: People get scared.

MARTHA: She was a bit shy. The card said she was a bit shy.

HOWARD
MCHALE: Aw.

SCOTT LEWIS: Did you give your number up front?

MARTHA: No, I haven't done that yet. No, but you know what? I went to your house last night because I went to drop off my pledge and then I joined in on the little party y'all had, so that was really fun.

HOWARD
MCHALE: Oh, at KPFT?

SCOTT LEWIS: Oh, great.

MARTHA: Yeah. I went to the house last night and it was really fun because I got to hang out and this little duo made their debut. You know? So they were like a singer songwriter, two guys who played the guitar and sang.

HOWARD
MCHALE: Oh, how nice.

MARTHA: Yeah--

SCOTT LEWIS: What was the woman's name that sent you the flowers?

MARTHA: Her name's Terry. Terry.

HOWARD
MCHALE: Terry.

MARTHA: Yeah.

SCOTT LEWIS: Terry, if you're listening--

MARTHA: She's 26 years old.

SCOTT LEWIS: And she has--

MARTHA: She's 26 years old.

SCOTT LEWIS: And she has your number?

MARTHA: She has my work number.

HOWARD Well, Terry, you call.

MCHALE:

SCOTT LEWIS: Terry, you need to call her.

MARTHA: And she can call anytime during regular business hours.

HOWARD And stop being shy, Terry.

MCHALE:

SCOTT LEWIS: Yeah, Terry, don't be shy. You took the first step.

MARTHA: There's no need to be shy with me. People are real receptive to me, you know? Yeah. They're favorably impressed, maybe, when they meet me. She wouldn't have anything to worry about, you know?

HOWARD Oh, I don't think she's-- she's just scared. It's a first big step for a lot of people.

MCHALE:

SCOTT LEWIS: Yeah.

HOWARD You know what I mean?

MCHALE:

MARTHA: Well, I'm curious-- I'm curious myself as well. [INAUDIBLE].

HOWARD So you could spend all that time writing a letter in a personal column or just listen and called us.

MCHALE:

MARTHA: Oh, no, I already wrote the thank you card. I wrote the thank you card already and sealed up, but it just hasn't been delivered yet.

HOWARD OK, great.

MCHALE:

SCOTT LEWIS: Oh, great. We'll look for that. Thanks for calling, Marta.

MARTHA: Yeah. OK, well, thank you.

HOWARD Bye. Bye bye.

MCHALE:

SCOTT LEWIS: Can we take another call? Caller, are you there?

VICTORIA: Yes, I am.

SCOTT LEWIS: Who's this?

VICTORIA: This is Victoria.

HOWARD Oh, Victoria.

MCHALE:

SCOTT LEWIS: Girl, we've hung up on you how many times tonight?

VICTORIA: Oh, about four.

HOWARD Victoria, you're--

MCHALE:

SCOTT LEWIS: We're so sorry.

HOWARD You're supposed to give a fake name.

MCHALE:

VICTORIA: Y'all are just too much. You know, you just wear me out. I keep calling back and back and--

[INTERPOSING VOICES]

HOWARD It's been a busy night here at KPFT.

MCHALE:

SCOTT LEWIS: What are you looking for, Victoria?

VICTORIA: I have a lot.

SCOTT LEWIS: Oh. A lot what?

HOWARD Now you're a straight girl, right?

MCHALE:

VICTORIA: Yes.

HOWARD Yay.

MCHALE:

SCOTT LEWIS: Oh, so you're looking for a man.

VICTORIA: I need a man.

SCOTT LEWIS: This is our first straight one tonight.

HOWARD Yay.

MCHALE:

SCOTT LEWIS: Well, you know, Melissa, that guy from-- the sheikh from Arabi that called her on his car phone.

VICTORIA: Well, you know what? He's got to have a limo.

HOWARD He's got to have a limo?

MCHALE:

SCOTT LEWIS: What about that--

VICTORIA: And lots and lots of money.

SCOTT LEWIS: What about that one that mooned me on the way in tonight?

VICTORIA: Oh, you know what? I heard about that and I liked it.

SCOTT LEWIS: Well, I didn't. Just what I want to see is a man's butt driving down 59.

VICTORIA: And you were talking about working the floor. Yes. Let me tell you about working the floor.

HOWARD OK, girl, so where's-- you have a boyfriend, though, don't you?

MCHALE:

VICTORIA: Of course.

HOWARD And where is he at right now?

MCHALE:

VICTORIA: He's sleeping.

HOWARD Why is he sleeping?

MCHALE:

VICTORIA: Because I wore him out.

[LAUGHTER]

HOWARD And you're looking for another-- you're looking for another man to wear out?

MCHALE:

VICTORIA: Well, no. I mean, you know, he's isn't up, I'll go wake him up.

HOWARD Oh, Victoria, you're a wild beast.

MCHALE:

VICTORIA: Yeah, I'm just such a beast.

HOWARD I know. So you're not looking for, you just want to call in and say hi, huh?

MCHALE:

VICTORIA: Yes.

HOWARD How wonderful.
MCHALE:

VICTORIA: You sound so good on the radio.

HOWARD Oh, thank you. We're wonderful.
MCHALE:

SCOTT LEWIS: What do you think about Bobby Brown and this 14-year-old in Mexico?

VICTORIA: I think that he should have chosen little señoritas in another-- was it Hispanic and in that country or one from this country?

HOWARD Oh, OK. We think-- have you been smoking marijuana tonight?
MCHALE:

SCOTT LEWIS: Are you drunk?

VICTORIA: No.

HOWARD Oh, OK.
MCHALE:

SCOTT LEWIS: Just taking a survey.

VICTORIA: No, I'm just saying, was it one there or here?

HOWARD Oh, no. It was--
MCHALE:

VICTORIA: It's a big difference whenever you do it there or here.

HOWARD From what I understand, she lives in Atlanta and Whitney Houston has been elevating her career.
MCHALE:

VICTORIA: You know, because whenever they do it there--

HOWARD It's not a crime.
MCHALE:

VICTORIA: --they start at probably 10.

HOWARD Uh-uh.
MCHALE:

VICTORIA: You know?

HOWARD Oh, wow.
MCHALE:

SCOTT LEWIS: Howard prostituted himself in Mexico beginning at 8.

HOWARD I know. I didn't make any money.

MCHALE:

SCOTT LEWIS: His first customer was Moses.

HOWARD Oh, Moses. Poncho villo.

MCHALE:

VICTORIA: He gave it up?

HOWARD Uh-huh.

MCHALE:

SCOTT LEWIS: No, he hasn't given it up. As a matter of fact, you can see him on Avondale right after the show.

VICTORIA: I think not.

HOWARD Thank you, Victoria. Someone needs to stick up for me.

MCHALE:

VICTORIA: I will.

HOWARD OK.

MCHALE:

VICTORIA: You've got a better corner.

HOWARD Oh.

MCHALE:

VICTORIA: I've already seen him on.

HOWARD Thank you, Victoria.

MCHALE:

SCOTT LEWIS: Thanks, Victoria.

VICTORIA: What is your name?

HOWARD Oh.

MCHALE:

SCOTT LEWIS: Oh, this is Scott.

VICTORIA: Hello, Scott.

SCOTT LEWIS: Pleasure to meet you.

VICTORIA: You too.

SCOTT LEWIS: You have a great voice.

VICTORIA: Thanks.

HOWARD Oh, she's a pretty girl too.

MCHALE:

SCOTT LEWIS: Is she?

HOWARD I know--

MCHALE:

SCOTT LEWIS: Woman.

HOWARD Woman, no girl, whatever. But I mean--

MCHALE:

VICTORIA: All woman.

HOWARD --if I was her boyfriend, I wouldn't be sleeping. Oh, are you still there, Victoria?

MCHALE:

SCOTT LEWIS: Victoria? Well, so much for Victoria. Can we take another call?

HOWARD Sure, hit the button.

MCHALE:

SCOTT LEWIS: Caller, are you there?

ANTHONY: Yeah, I'm here.

SCOTT LEWIS: Who's this?

ANTHONY: This is Anthony.

HOWARD Anthony.

MCHALE:

SCOTT LEWIS: Anthony.

HOWARD Hi, Tony.

MCHALE:

SCOTT LEWIS: Anthony, I hear you found a husband on this show.

ANTHONY: Yeah, from last month.

HOWARD Yay!

MCHALE:

Yeah.

SCOTT LEWIS: And what happened?

ANTHONY: Well, I'm just calling to say thank you. I've never been so happy in my life.

HOWARD Hey, tell us about the date and the meeting.

MCHALE:

SCOTT LEWIS: Tell us the first date. What happened?

ANTHONY: OK, well, we talked for one week before we actually went out. And so I got to know him real good before we went out.

HOWARD OK.

MCHALE:

ANTHONY: And so we went out. We went out to eat and then we went back to his place.

HOWARD OK.

MCHALE:

SCOTT LEWIS: And then?

ANTHONY: And then so on.

SCOTT LEWIS: So if you were in the military-- no.

HOWARD That old military one again.

MCHALE:

SCOTT LEWIS: That old military question.

HOWARD So you had fun?

MCHALE:

ANTHONY: Yeah, exactly.

SCOTT LEWIS: And what's his name?

ANTHONY: Ron.

SCOTT LEWIS: Ron. And so it's all working out great?

ANTHONY: Perfect.

SCOTT LEWIS: Oh, great. Well, that's great. That's two success stories off the last show.

HOWARD Yes. how come we can't do that for us?

MCHALE:

SCOTT LEWIS: I know. We can't find anybody.

HOWARD Oh, Victoria got cut off again. Victoria, we were talking to you and you hung up.

MCHALE:

SCOTT LEWIS: I tell you.

HOWARD That boyfriend must have came in the bedroom.

MCHALE:

SCOTT LEWIS: So has he sent you flowers yet or anything or have you sent him flowers?

ANTHONY: No, but he's given me a few presents.

SCOTT LEWIS: I bet he has.

HOWARD Give us a quick recap, your ages and where you lived and all that.

MCHALE:

ANTHONY: OK. I'm 18. He's 30-- 31.

HOWARD Oh.

MCHALE:

SCOTT LEWIS: Mhm.

HOWARD Mhm.

MCHALE:

ANTHONY: Uh-huh. And I live in Northwest, he lives somewhere on the South Side.

HOWARD Uh-huh. So romance is going real good?

MCHALE:

ANTHONY: Really good.

HOWARD And you met here from After Hours with Scott and Howard?

MCHALE:

ANTHONY: Uh-huh.

HOWARD Yay.

MCHALE:

SCOTT LEWIS: Yay. Congratulations, Anthony. We're glad. Don't call us if you get a divorce.

HOWARD Yeah. Now Anthony, would you like to say hi to him on the air?

MCHALE:

ANTHONY: Hi.

HOWARD Huh?

MCHALE:

ANTHONY: Hi and I love you.

HOWARD Aw.

MCHALE:

SCOTT LEWIS: Aw. That is so sweet.

HOWARD That's so sweet.

MCHALE:

SCOTT LEWIS: Thanks for calling, Anthony.

ANTHONY: He also wanted me to mention to Jimmy--

HOWARD Yeah?

MCHALE:

ANTHONY: --that he never got his coffee mugs.

HOWARD Oh.

MCHALE:

SCOTT LEWIS: Uh-oh.

ANTHONY: Yeah.

HOWARD Hey, you know what? Call back and then you'll hit with Matt and Matt will hook you up with the coffee mugs. OK.

MCHALE: How's that?

ANTHONY: OK.

HOWARD Thanks, Anthony.

MCHALE:

SCOTT LEWIS: Another success story. I tell you what, we're going to have--

HOWARD Oh, I'm going to cry. I'm going to cry.

MCHALE:

SCOTT LEWIS: What we're going to have to do-- let's take these last few calls, and then we're going to have to go over all these lists and we're going to have to hook some of these people up.

HOWARD I'm so sad. Everyone's happy except for me.

MCHALE:

SCOTT LEWIS: This is great. I know. Me and you both, please.

HOWARD God, I haven't had a date in years.

MCHALE:

SCOTT LEWIS: Let's see. Well, since you broke up with Lewis and Clark.

BILL: Hello.

SCOTT LEWIS: Hi, caller. Are you there?

BILL: Hi, how are you doing?

SCOTT LEWIS: Great. Who's this?

BILL: This is Bill again.

HOWARD Hi, Bill.

MCHALE:

BILL: I just finished talking to Matt and he says I'm landsharking it.

SCOTT LEWIS: What does that mean?

BILL: I don't know.

SCOTT LEWIS: Does that mean-- do you think that means he's into water sports?

BILL: Hate when that happens.

SCOTT LEWIS: And it's Bill, right?

BILL: Huh? Yeah, it's Bill.

SCOTT LEWIS: Bill. So now, Bill, are you looking for a special someone?

BILL: Oh, of course I am. Aren't we all?

SCOTT LEWIS: And are you looking for a man or a woman?

BILL: Oh, man.

SCOTT LEWIS: A man.

BILL: How about that?

HOWARD I'd like to talk to some straight men tonight.

MCHALE:

SCOTT LEWIS: How old are you?

BILL: I can play straight.

HOWARD He can play straight.

MCHALE:

[LAUGHTER]

SCOTT LEWIS: How old are you?

BILL: I'm 23.

SCOTT LEWIS: 23.

HOWARD Nice age.

MCHALE:

SCOTT LEWIS: And what size shoes do you wear?

BILL: 18-- no.

SCOTT LEWIS: An 18-- oh. Listen, here's my address.

HOWARD You work for Barnum and Bailey, right?

MCHALE:

BILL: I wear a 10 and a half.

SCOTT LEWIS: 10 and a half. Good size, good size.

BILL: And I keep swapping those bunks. I don't know whether I'm a top or bottom.

SCOTT LEWIS: Oh. Bill, Bill, Bill. I'll be giving you my address off air momentarily.

HOWARD Bill, you are bad. Bad, bad to the bone.

MCHALE:

BILL: Yeah.

SCOTT LEWIS: What's your ideal first date?

BILL: Ideal first date. Well, you know, yeah, you got to start with the food thing. Have a good, nice dinner and then usually go probably JR or something like that, talk, have a couple of drinks, and then go dancing.

HOWARD Where's your favorite place to dance?

MCHALE:

BILL: It depends. You can either get Riches or BRB. One of those.

HOWARD Oh, you're a country boy?

MCHALE:

SCOTT LEWIS: Oh, the BRB.

HOWARD Now do lead or follow when you two-step?

MCHALE:

BILL: Both. Both.

HOWARD God, you are just--

MCHALE:

SCOTT LEWIS: God, you are versatile.

HOWARD Mhm. OK.

MCHALE:

BILL: Well, just going to have to move to Texas.

HOWARD OK, question. Do you prefer a Big Mac or a quarter pounder?

MCHALE:

BILL: Oh. Geez, that's a rough one.

SCOTT LEWIS: So is Howard in the morning.

BILL: How about how about the Colossus from Jack in the Box?

HOWARD Hey.

MCHALE:

SCOTT LEWIS: Oh.

HOWARD You know, I hate men who don't answer the questions when they're asked. Don't you?

MCHALE:

BILL: Well, I mean--

HOWARD Big Mac or--

MCHALE:

BILL: Well--

HOWARD --quarter pounder.

MCHALE:

BILL: --it's not the size of the burger, it's the contents.

HOWARD No, no.

MCHALE:

SCOTT LEWIS: He might not like McDonald's.

HOWARD No.

MCHALE:

BILL: That's true, I don't like McDonald's.

HOWARD Well, I mean, do you-- see, now you're missing the whole point. You are missing the whole point.

MCHALE:

BILL: No, I'm not missing the whole point.

HOWARD Yes, you are. I'm asking you because there might be someone out there who's looking for a man who likes either
MCHALE: a quarter pounder or a Big Mac. Do you see what I'm saying?

BILL: Mhm.

SCOTT LEWIS: Bill, I think we might even have a connection for you right here.

BILL: How about a Happy Meal?

SCOTT LEWIS: A Happy Meal? At 23 I think you still qualify to buy those.

HOWARD That's right.
MCHALE:

SCOTT LEWIS: I think you can still get that. And which Flintstone character would you want, Bill?

BILL: Ooh.

HOWARD It's like when you open that vitamin bottle in the morning, which do you hope plops out in your hand?
MCHALE:

BILL: Eh, Fred.

HOWARD Fred?
MCHALE:

SCOTT LEWIS: Oh, I look a lot like Fred.

HOWARD You look a lot more like Barney.
MCHALE:

SCOTT LEWIS: I look a lot more like Homer Simpson. Bill, I think we have somebody already online interested-- no, I don't think he's online. Jeremy, where are you at? Jeremy, get over to the phone and call in. We need to see if we can do a conference call--

HOWARD Yes.
MCHALE:

SCOTT LEWIS: --with these two guys, so I'm going to put you on hold, Jeremy.

BILL: Wait, which one was Jeremy?

SCOTT LEWIS: I mean Bill.

HOWARD Don't be picky.
MCHALE:

SCOTT LEWIS: Let me go back through my notes. Let me go back through my notes. Jeremy, Jeremy.

BILL: Wait, I thought we were talking to Chuck. He's the one with the size 13, right?

SCOTT LEWIS: Oh, you want to talk to Chuck? We'll get Chuck.

HOWARD Jeremy, Bill does not want you.

MCHALE:

SCOTT LEWIS: Sorry, Jeremy. We tried. Chuck. Chuck.

BILL: Fine, make me out to be the thing that-- never mind.

SCOTT LEWIS: Hey, you're the one who said it.

CREW: [INAUDIBLE]

SCOTT LEWIS: What do I want to do with Bill? I can't say that on air.

CREW: Do you want to hang up on him?

SCOTT LEWIS: Actually, wait, I want to hold on to Bill.

BILL: No, now, you better not hang up on me again.

SCOTT LEWIS: I want Chuck to call.

HOWARD OK.

MCHALE:

SCOTT LEWIS: Are you-- Bill, we're putting you on hold, OK?

BILL: OK.

SCOTT LEWIS: Don't go anywhere. Oh, I tell you, what a night.

HOWARD What a night.

MCHALE:

SCOTT LEWIS: This is crazy. So Chuck and Jere-- let's put their papers together. Chuck and Jeremy.

HOWARD OK.

MCHALE:

SCOTT LEWIS: I mean, Chuck and Bill. Why do I keep--

HOWARD So Chuck, you have to call back so we can hook you up with Bill.

MCHALE:

SCOTT LEWIS: We can go get his number and call him back. Let's take another caller briefly before we hook those two up.
Caller, are you there?

VICTORIA: Yes, I am.

SCOTT LEWIS: Who's this?

HOWARD Victoria, are you back?

MCHALE:

VICTORIA: It's me.

SCOTT LEWIS: Victoria, you are wearing me out, girl.

VICTORIA: She's back. She's back.

SCOTT LEWIS: Are you high, [? Clary ?]?

VICTORIA: No. You know what happened is--

HOWARD What?

MCHALE:

VICTORIA: --I walked over my cord and I ripped it out of the wall. I just-- I walk all over my house. I need one of these remote things.

SCOTT LEWIS: I hate when the cord comes ripping out of the wall, don't you?

VICTORIA: I hate it too.

HOWARD I think you need something-- a comforter and a pillow. Go to bed.

MCHALE:

VICTORIA: Get out. Get out.

SCOTT LEWIS: So what are you up to tonight?

VICTORIA: About 5 foot 10.

SCOTT LEWIS: Oh, kind of a tall woman.

HOWARD Oh, and she's got red hair.

MCHALE:

SCOTT LEWIS: Oh, look, Evelyn. Evelyn's perking up. Would you ever consider a woman?

VICTORIA: No, my name is not Evelyn, it's Victoria.

HOWARD No, no.

MCHALE:

SCOTT LEWIS: No, no, no.

VICTORIA: --might call me Myrna. That will work.

SCOTT LEWIS: Listen, girl. Evelyn is here in the studio and when she heard you were 5'10, she perked up.

VICTORIA: Oh, she did?

SCOTT LEWIS: Would you ever consider a woman?

VICTORIA: How does she look?

SCOTT LEWIS: Huh? Very attractive.

VICTORIA: Is she slim?

HOWARD Yes.

MCHALE:

VICTORIA: Then--

HOWARD She looks like a pretzel rod.

MCHALE:

VICTORIA: Well, I don't like them bony.

SCOTT LEWIS: She's not that bony. I wouldn't call her bony. Victoria, you're an animal.

VICTORIA: No, I'm such a beast.

HOWARD You are such a beast.

MCHALE:

SCOTT LEWIS: You are a beast. Victoria, go to bed, girl.

VICTORIA: No, I don't want to.

SCOTT LEWIS: OK.

VICTORIA: I'm 35, I don't need to.

SCOTT LEWIS: Oh, well, that's true.

VICTORIA: Anyway, back to the main track.

HOWARD Back to the main track.

MCHALE:

VICTORIA: What do you want to know?

SCOTT LEWIS: We want to know what time you go to bed.

VICTORIA: Whenever I get tired.

SCOTT LEWIS: Oh, OK. Well, that was about five minutes ago. We'll talk to you soon, Victoria.

HOWARD Thanks for calling.

MCHALE:

SCOTT LEWIS: All right, bye bye.

HOWARD We love you.

MCHALE:

SCOTT LEWIS: Whew. Did you catch that, whenever I get tired. Well, that was about five minutes ago. Gee. Are we a mess?

HOWARD Thanks, Victoria. We love you.

MCHALE:

SCOTT LEWIS: We love you, Victoria. Let's take another call because we-- and we need to get Bill--

HOWARD And Chuck.

MCHALE:

SCOTT LEWIS: --and Chuck hooked up.

HOWARD Yes, and we also have a special request. Now you know that sometimes, listeners, we have Melissa or Kate

MCHALE: answering telephone for us.

SCOTT LEWIS: And we always have Matt.

HOWARD Always have Matt. Exactly. But we bring in these two beautiful girls, who are straight.

MCHALE:

SCOTT LEWIS: Heterosexual. Heterosexual women.

HOWARD And we have a special request. Is Kate still dateless, for a frustrated bisexual? Kate has been-- let me-- I just saw

MCHALE: her the other day. We used to work together, now we don't. She is, by the way, dateless, and I have her phone number. So call back up and I will make a love connection to her. We'll call her on the air and see if she's home.

SCOTT LEWIS: Caller, are you there? Caller, you there?

MIKE: Yeah, I'm here.

SCOTT LEWIS: And who's this?

MIKE: This is Mike.

SCOTT LEWIS: Hi, Mike.

MIKE: Yeah, Mike. I guess I'm your straight caller for tonight.

SCOTT LEWIS: Oh.

HOWARD Yay.

MCHALE:

SCOTT LEWIS: Mike. Yay.

HOWARD Yay, yay, yay, yay.

MCHALE:

SCOTT LEWIS: So are you are you dateless and desperate in Houston?

MIKE: No, no. Actually, my wife and I just moved to Houston.

SCOTT LEWIS: Oh, really?

HOWARD OK.

MCHALE:

MIKE: Yeah. You know what we're looking for?

SCOTT LEWIS: What?

HOWARD What?

MCHALE:

MIKE: We're looking for-- we're interested in those good techno rave clubs here.

SCOTT LEWIS: Oh.

And we haven't really found any.

HOWARD Those what? Those what?

MCHALE:

SCOTT LEWIS: Have you been to Numbers?

MIKE: No, no. We haven't been to Numbers.

SCOTT LEWIS: Numbers is probably the best one.

MIKE: Really?

SCOTT LEWIS: Yeah.

MIKE: For techno and rave?

SCOTT LEWIS: Yeah, definitely. Numbers is the best. Magic Bus is another real good one.

HOWARD But that's real young. How old are you?

MCHALE:

MIKE: Magic Bus?

HOWARD Yeah. How old are you?

MCHALE:

MIKE: 24.

SCOTT LEWIS: Oh, yeah. You could go to Magic Bus.

MIKE: Where's that at?

SCOTT LEWIS: Magic Bus and Numbers.

MIKE: Where's Magic Bus?

SCOTT LEWIS: Magic Bus is on 2AM at-- what's that?

HOWARD Albany.

MCHALE:

SCOTT LEWIS: Mm, no--

HOWARD Eh, it's right there.

MCHALE:

SCOTT LEWIS: Genesee. Genesee.

HOWARD No, it's the next one down. You can't miss it. It's this big, ugly blue building right on Fairview.

MCHALE:

SCOTT LEWIS: Yeah. Fairview turns into 2AM. And then Numbers is right on Westheimer down at the lower Westheimer.

HOWARD Yeah, just past Taft.

MCHALE:

MIKE: Yeah. I think we've passed that one too.

HOWARD Oh, yeah.

MCHALE:

SCOTT LEWIS: Just look them up in the phone book, Magic Bus and Numbers.

MIKE: Magic Bus and Numbers. What nights are the better nights to go?

HOWARD The weekend, of course.

MCHALE:

SCOTT LEWIS: Yeah.

MIKE: Friday or Saturday?

HOWARD Friday, Saturday night. Even Club Some after hours.

MCHALE:

SCOTT LEWIS: Club Some afterwards, yes.

HOWARD By Emos.

MCHALE:

SCOTT LEWIS: They open, what? Midnight, 1:00 AM, and they're open--

HOWARD Yeah, 2 o'clock--

MCHALE:

SCOTT LEWIS: They're open--

HOWARD --till 6 in the morning

MCHALE:

SCOTT LEWIS: --till, like, 6.

MIKE: Club Some?

HOWARD S-O-M-E.

MCHALE:

MIKE: S-O-M-E.

HOWARD Right next to Emos.

MCHALE:

MIKE: S-O-M-E.

HOWARD And that's probably the most New York stylish retro club in Houston after hours.

MCHALE:

MIKE: That's cool.

HOWARD Yeah, that's fun. That's fun.

MCHALE:

MIKE: Are these gay, straight, mixed or whatever?

HOWARD No--

MCHALE:

SCOTT LEWIS: Numbers is probably pretty straight, and I've never been in Magic Bus, and Some is real mixed.

HOWARD Real mixed.

MCHALE:

MIKE: Some is a real mixed?

SCOTT LEWIS: Yeah.

MIKE: Because we prefer kind of the mixed clubs.

HOWARD You'll like Club Some.

MCHALE:

SCOTT LEWIS: Yeah, you'll like Club Some. What exactly are you looking for there, Mike? Are you all looking to find somebody at these clubs or what?

MIKE: Actually, you know, are y'all very familiar with San Antonio at all?

HOWARD Yes.

MCHALE:

SCOTT LEWIS: Yeah.

HOWARD Oh, do we.

MCHALE:

MIKE: We're looking for a Bonham Exchange here in Houston. That kind of thing.

HOWARD Oh.

MCHALE:

SCOTT LEWIS: Oh. Rich's kind of.

HOWARD Rich's on a Thursday.

MCHALE:

SCOTT LEWIS: Yeah. Rich's on a Thursday.

MIKE: Rich's on a Thursday?

HOWARD On San Jacinto.

MCHALE:

MIKE: What, is that not good or what do you mean?

HOWARD No.

MCHALE:

SCOTT LEWIS: No, we were just trying to think--

MIKE: Y'all sound disappointed.

SCOTT LEWIS: No.

HOWARD No.

MCHALE:

SCOTT LEWIS: No, no, we were just trying to think of what to compare to the Bonham Exchange.

HOWARD Yeah. Real simple. Rich's on Thursday.

MCHALE:

SCOTT LEWIS: I would say Rich's on Thursday is your best bet for something like that.

HOWARD All my straight friends go there on Thursday and it's a real mixed, mixed, mixed crowd.

MCHALE:

MIKE: Rich's on Thursday.

HOWARD Yeah, Rich's on Thursday nights. It's called Hedonism.

MCHALE:

SCOTT LEWIS: Yeah, it's called--

MIKE: So what, should we not go to Numbers and Magic Bus and all these, or what?

SCOTT LEWIS: Well, it depends on what you're looking for. If you're just looking to go dancing and have a good time, you can go anywhere. If you're looking to find somebody to come home for a three way--

MIKE: No. Actually, we're looking for the music is what we're looking for.

HOWARD
MCHALE: Oh, OK.

SCOTT LEWIS: Go to any of the three. Rich's on a Thursday is going to be real Bonham Exchange. It's real house music.

MIKE: Yeah, yeah. That's good.

SCOTT LEWIS: Real good music. One of the best DJs in town they have over there on Thursday nights.

MIKE: All right.

HOWARD
MCHALE: And it's probably the closest thing to the Bonham Exchange.

MIKE: That's cool.

HOWARD
MCHALE: Even though I prefer the Wild Crowd.

MIKE: Oh, no, the Wild Club?

HOWARD
MCHALE: Yeah.

MIKE: Yeah, Yeah. No, we go there after.

SCOTT LEWIS: Oh, God, I love the Wild Club.

HOWARD
MCHALE: Oh, the Wild Club.

SCOTT LEWIS: The Wild Club.

HOWARD
MCHALE: That paper moon is poopoo.

SCOTT LEWIS: Thanks for calling, Mike. Numbers--

MIKE: Yeah.

SCOTT LEWIS: --Magic Bus, Rich's on Thursday.

HOWARD
MCHALE: Bye, Mike.

SCOTT LEWIS: OK, now we've got-- do we have both Bill and Chuck? Let's put them on.

HOWARD OK. Let's learn how to run those buttons.

MCHALE:

SCOTT LEWIS: We're trying to figure out this phone system. Callers, are you there?

BILL: I'm here.

CHUCK: I'm here.

SCOTT LEWIS: Are you Bill and Chuck? Ah!

HOWARD Oh, a love connection.

MCHALE:

SCOTT LEWIS: A love connection, finally.

HOWARD You guys have to talk real loud, OK?

MCHALE:

BILL: How loud?

HOWARD Oh, loud enough so we can hear you.

MCHALE:

SCOTT LEWIS: That's right.

HOWARD We can hear you.

MCHALE:

SCOTT LEWIS: Now Chuck, refresh. You are 6 foot 4, black hair, size 13 shoe-- Goddamn it. Chuck, I wanted to keep you for myself. 23--

HOWARD Can't hog them all.

MCHALE:

SCOTT LEWIS: I know. 23 years old and Bill-- I lost my page on Bill. Bill, tell me about yourself.

BILL: Well, I'm 6 foot. I'm about 180 pounds. I have blond hair and green eyes.

HOWARD Oh.

MCHALE:

SCOTT LEWIS: Oh. How old are you?

BILL: 23.

SCOTT LEWIS: 23.

HOWARD Now is it true that dark haired men are attracted to lighter haired men? Is that your preference?

MCHALE:

CHUCK: Oh, no, actually, it doesn't matter.

HOWARD OK.

MCHALE:

SCOTT LEWIS: What part of town do you live in, Chuck?

CHUCK: I live way out by Texas City.

HOWARD Yeah, remember?

MCHALE:

SCOTT LEWIS: Oh, that's right. And Bill, whereabouts do you live?

BILL: I live in West Houston, almost to Katy.

HOWARD Oh, complete opposite.

MCHALE:

SCOTT LEWIS: Whoa, that's a long drive. Where are you all going to meet?

HOWARD Say hello to each other.

MCHALE:

CHUCK: Hi.

BILL: Not at-- hi, how are you doing?

SCOTT LEWIS: Not where?

BILL: Not at Heaven. I'll meet you at JR's.

CHUCK: OK.

HOWARD OK, what day are you guys going to meet? You ought to meet us for a Beer Bus tomorrow.

MCHALE:

SCOTT LEWIS: Yeah, tomorrow night, Beer Bus, Mining Company. We're always there.

BILL: That's cool.

CHUCK: Yeah, that sounds good.

HOWARD OK. Now we have a scheduled date here. I probably won't be there because I have to work tomorrow night, but--

MCHALE:

SCOTT LEWIS: What time do you get off?

HOWARD 11-ish.

MCHALE:

SCOTT LEWIS: Well, I'm not going to go without you.

HOWARD I know.

MCHALE:

SCOTT LEWIS: Oh, wait. It sounds like we're having the date.

HOWARD Oh. Oh, wait. OK. You know what we're going to do? What we're going to do is we're going to let you guys-- Bill,

MCHALE: can we give him your phone number?

BILL: Sure.

HOWARD OK. Bill and Chuck, we're going to give-- we're going to give Bill the phone number and then you guys talk for a

MCHALE: while and make out a date and keep us posted.

SCOTT LEWIS: Do. And we'll probably call you back in a few weeks and see how it's going.

BILL: All right.

HOWARD OK?

MCHALE:

BILL: All right, guys?

CHUCK: All right.

BILL: All right, hold on.

HOWARD Aw.

MCHALE:

SCOTT LEWIS: Aw, love connection number one for the night.

HOWARD Oh, I'm so excited. I hope they get married.

MCHALE:

SCOTT LEWIS: I do too.

HOWARD Think they'll have kids?

MCHALE:

SCOTT LEWIS: Eh, I kind of wanted that Chuck for myself.

HOWARD Oh, you want them all.

MCHALE:

SCOTT LEWIS: I know. I have time for them all. Let's do--

HOWARD You've got a waist for them all.

MCHALE:

SCOTT LEWIS: This is true. Please, I've got enough butt to go around. Can we take another call?

CHRISTOPHER: Hello.

SCOTT LEWIS: Hi, caller, are you there?

HOWARD Hello?

MCHALE:

CHRISTOPHER: Hello.

SCOTT LEWIS: Hi, you're on the air. Who's this?

CHRISTOPHER: This is Christopher again.

SCOTT LEWIS: Christopher?

CHRISTOPHER: Yeah.

HOWARD Hey, Christopher. What's going on?

MCHALE:

CHRISTOPHER: Not much. I was just waiting.

SCOTT LEWIS: Christopher, we had--

CHRISTOPHER: One of those inexperienced callers calling.

SCOTT LEWIS: We had a caller for you, Christopher.

CHRISTOPHER: Yeah, that-- yeah.

SCOTT LEWIS: OK. We'll want that paper up. OK.

CHRISTOPHER: Sorry, Sheldon. I mean--

SCOTT LEWIS: That's OK.

HOWARD That's OK.

MCHALE:

SCOTT LEWIS: There's somebody for everybody--

HOWARD That's right.

MCHALE:

SCOTT LEWIS: --and you just have to-- please, let me tell you. Somebody told me one time-- I used to be kind of shy about trying to pick somebody up in a bar or whatever, trying to get to know somebody, or trying to involved--

HOWARD Meet someone.

MCHALE:

SCOTT LEWIS: Meet someone, get involved with someone, whatever. And a friend, a good friend of mine told me, he said, you know, if you go up to that person or if you talk to someone and if they reject you, you've lost nothing. It's when they're interested that the trouble starts.

CHRISTOPHER: Well, I'll tell you what. Someone's got to be out there that's on their way home or cruising around. They're leaving Dave & Buster's, which is a really cool place. I like to go there. HOWARD I caught it. I caught it.

MCHALE:

CHRISTOPHER: Oh, by the way, by the way, I loved what you said to Victoria. When do you get-- she said, when I get tired. I got that and I laughed so hard, man. That was so funny.

HOWARD Oh, Victoria was so sweet.

MCHALE:

SCOTT LEWIS: Poor Victoria. She was a sweetheart.

HOWARD She was.

MCHALE:

SCOTT LEWIS: God love her. I think she stopped here on her way to 89.3, though.

CHRISTOPHER: I think she needs to put that peace pipe down and take a little rest or something, but--

HOWARD Exactly.

MCHALE:

CHRISTOPHER: OK, I'm really cool.

SCOTT LEWIS: You sound it, Chuck.

CHRISTOPHER: I have a great personality.

SCOTT LEWIS: No confidence problem here.

HOWARD No self esteem problem.

MCHALE:

CHRISTOPHER: I have no problem meeting women. That's the problem. I mean, every-- I go anywhere and women are throwing themselves at me. And I just broke up with my girlfriend because she wanted to get extremely serious and I'm not-- I want to go the other direction for a little while.

HOWARD How old were you again? I'm sorry.

MCHALE:

CHRISTOPHER: 25.

HOWARD 25, OK. And you just want to play for a while?

MCHALE:

CHRISTOPHER: Yeah, or--

HOWARD God, I wish I was 10 years younger, honey.

MCHALE:

CHRISTOPHER: I'm open minded. I have a very open mind.

SCOTT LEWIS: Please, open legged is what we want to hear.

HOWARD Shh, Scott.

MCHALE:

CHRISTOPHER: Hey.

HOWARD Hey, isn't he terrible?

MCHALE:

SCOTT LEWIS: Please, I'm going to give you my number. Somebody give him my number. We will keep looking for you.

CHRISTOPHER: OK.

SCOTT LEWIS: OK, keep listening. Thanks.
