You know, don't want to say sex and then go in the bathroom and use your toothbrush. Because Because of transmission of other things, you know, Hepatitis B is much easier to transmit than HIV. And if you go in and use your toothbrush or use their razor, you may not contract HIV, but but you're going to contract hepatitis B, just to let you know how it's likely to be transmitted without a sore in the mouth, which which is oral sex, it can be transmitted, you know, by saliva, basically, that's what you need to worry about in saliva. Seven to 14 days outside of the body, wow, if it's dried blood exposed to the atmosphere, Hepatitis B will live seven to 14 days, HIV won't HIV dies as soon as it hits there, right. But Hepatitis B live seven to 14 days out because it's 17 times easier to get than HIV. And so toothbrushes and razors, I mean, anything, I think safer sex under the umbrella of HIV, but there's so much out there that you can get it's more protection of yourself protection from from the common cold protection from bacteria protection from from everything, you know, and, and the thing that I always tell people is go ahead and send me a picture. I tell people this because I've heard it from from one of my good friends, I have to give him credit for it. But you know, send us a picture of the team to ask for a sign for because I don't believe there's one out there. It doesn't have to be a Dirty Picture. Just give me a headshot. Because I want to see it. And that's darling from from HIV from hepatitis C that time from anything, you know, pneumonia. Anything. Yep.

And that is how most women will find out they have it. Because it's logical problems that they finally

I mean, I'm loosely using a statistic here in in the majority of cases is going to be good for three months. But HIV can stay in in and not be detected for six months. Wow. And so I do it every six months, just just to make sure just to be on the safe side. Even though I'm using tape text at all times. I do it I do it to remind me every six months, this is why you're practicing states that right? And if it inconveniences your life, all of a sudden we're in that condom becomes a whole lot more important. Yes, because of that two weeks waiting for those test results to come back will kill you every time. Wow, no matter if you've been safe or not. And so but but that is something to do, as a T cell count drops faster and women a man before their HIV transmission. For the first before the first symptom occurs in men, it will usually take about 10 to 12 years in women it will take only eight to 10 years. So a woman will normally have her first symptom of a faster than Wow, yeah. full blown as the disease progresses much faster in women than it doesn't men see a whole disease from first symptom on the whole disease progresses much faster in women. And and if it does cause gynecological problems, you're going to be better quicker, basically. Wow. Yeah. So these are you know, and considering that that's one of the symptoms of HIV. I mean, it's it goes straight for your best possible organs. But you know, especially in women, I mean, just think I mean, your whole your whole system is designed to to create insane life, right? Imagine what it can do with the HIV virus. She what I try and tell people is that even even lesbians because it's something that we all understand. You can. You can be you can have sex on Friday night and not be pregnant until Sunday morning. Why? Because the semen will stay in you and stay warm and stay alive in your body for that long. It's the same with HIV. HIV stays alive in a woman's body longer. Wow. Because it has someplace to go. Yeah. live there. So you may not control Next HIV on Friday night, you may contract with on Sunday morning. Okay.

Okay, the statistics right now, always remember what statistics that anybody can can mix them up and turn them around to say whatever they want to. So kind of take these all with a grain of salt, they are all documented either through, mostly through CDC, which is the Center for Disease Control. Every 30 minutes, someone dies of AIDS, every 53 seconds, someone becomes HIV

positive in the state of Texas, both of those statistics are for the state of Texas. For the world, every seven minutes, someone beats every seven seconds, someone dies of AIDS and every 21 seconds, someone becomes HIV positive. If you remove the US statistic from the world, 92.75% of all cases are heterosexual. If you're not infected, that exposed, you're not immune, you're left. Not infected just means that there wasn't a big enough opening to enter into your bloodstream. In a metropolitan city like Houston, one in 250 people went in to interview people in a metropolitan city, over 1 million people are HIV positive. Something to remember, for women funding those two AIDS cases, not HIV cases. A lot of times that's a big concern with with lesbians, especially in sometimes women, is that there isn't enough funding, but just to know that that funding goes on AIDS cases and not HIV cases. And so even though women have the highest, most recent incident, and especially women of color, in contracting HIV, the funding isn't there, because it still goes on AIDS cases. Unfortunately, until those women actually come down with AIDS, we won't be seeing the funding for it. Wow. But some do. Get tested, Get tested. Get tested, because honestly, there are there is no lesbian category for statistics. So it's, you know, a lot of lesbians say, well, there's they're they're just not, they're Remapping. Well, and it's not even, you know, the invincible lesbian theory. But more than that, you know, a lot of people say that it's just never happened. I've never heard of it until, until well, first of all, I know people lesbian to lesbian who've never, you know, quote, unquote, true lesbians or quote unquote, true lesbian, right? Never had sex with a man, they still transmit as still transmitted to one another.

So but that's something to consider if you're settling somebody threat is they have not been able to prove whether or not it's the Chapman or whether or not it's the actual instrument, remember?

Okay, before we getting off into the Supreme Court decision on amendment two, I'd like to explain to any of the listeners out there who are not familiar with what amendment two is about. There were two parts to amendment two, and that was to officially discriminate against gay and lesbian people against an equal housing and job protection. And the other part of amendment two was to deny us legal access in the courts. And according to the northeast Supreme Court ruled against amendment two that was passed by the Colorado and vote voters in the six to three vote, it wasn't a five of the four now is a six to three. Yeah, it was a very convincing victory in favor of the gay and lesbian community. And the gist of it is that, according to justice, Anthony Kennedy, who was speaking for the majority on the court, he said that we must conclude that amendment two classifies homosexuals, not to further a proper legislative end, but to make them unequal to everyone else. This Colorado cannot do. Right. And one of the big arguments that people had on this was that amendment two that gays and lesbians were seeking special rights. And that was not so what we wanted was equal rights, you know, be equally protected against discrimination in housing and employment and equal access to the court and like Justice Kennedy said, we this the court cannot do and this is a conservative Supreme Court. Most of the judges. Yes, that's right. The most of the just justices up there were appointed either by Reagan or Bush.

But they're going to read, they're going to re introduce new legislation and rewarded in an attempt to please the court but you cannot you cannot discriminate against an entire class of people.
