We hear it and we feel angry, alienated and abused. GLAAD was founded in 1985. To let people in the media know that not everyone who hears that garbage applauds to educate media executives about the violence and discrimination that provokes and to encourage media programmers to take a closer more positive look at our community. Glad professionally represents our interests and brings our concerns outrageous and suggestions to the people in charge. And it's already had great success. Shock jocks had been forced to tone down their hateful rhetoric. Newspapers have run editorials condemning anti gay violence. And television networks have produced documentaries exploring gay culture, but glad needs your help. Because fad bashing with words and with fists is on the rise, and we can't rely on anyone but ourselves to fight against it. So if you don't like what you just heard, if you recognize the threat to our health, safety and civil rights, you've got two choices. Here's one,
